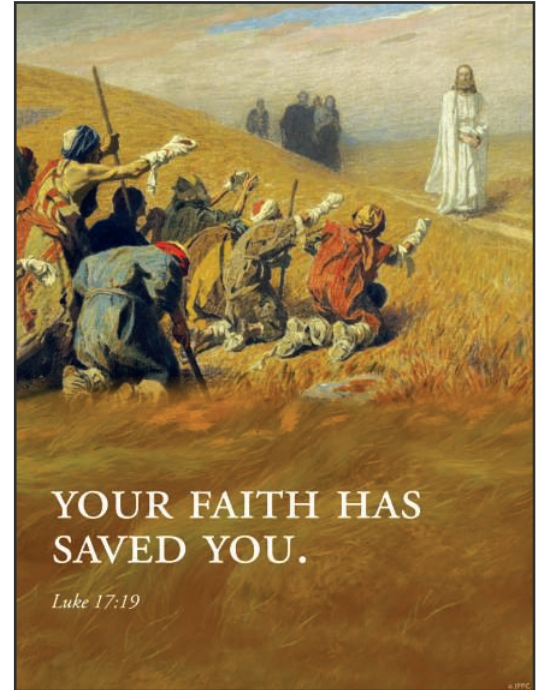
Good news: we have low-gluten hosts!

Pastor's Reflection

For some of a certain age, the Exodus event is colored by their memory of Charlton Heston in *The Ten Commandments*. If we put aside the Hollywood glitz, the Exodus event displays God's redemption of His Covenantal Promises. Please read the scripture for yourselves, (Ex. 1-24) though I'll offer here a quick overview.

Moses comes upon a burning bush which is not consumed by the fire. When he stops to investigate, God speaks to him, telling him to take off his shoes for he is "on holy ground." God tells Moses that He has heard the cries of his people, the Hebrews, who have been reduced to slavery in Egypt. As their covenant partner, God will redeem his promise to save them and lead them out of Egypt and into their own Promised Land. God commands Moses to deliver the divine edict to Pharaoh: Let My people go!

Moses asks God His Name. In this, Moses is reflecting the tradition of ancient Near Eastern religions: speaking the name of a god acts as an incantation, exercising a certain power over the god. These incantations, invoking the name of the god, act as a kind of magic, either to assuage the god's wrath or to coerce the god into bestowing blessings. But God answers with the cryptic YHWH, "I Am Who I Am," or more correctly, "I will be Who I will be." It's not a proper name, but rather a deflection of the question; God in effect is saying, "Never mind what My Name is. You can't control or manipulate Me. I will be faithful to you, but on My terms, not on your terms."

Moses delivers the edict to Pharaoh, who refuses to release the Hebrews. God then visits ten plagues upon the Egyptians, and the last is sending the Angel of Death to slay the first-born male of every Egyptian household.

At the same time, God commands the Hebrews to prepare to flee Egypt. They are to eat while dressed for a journey; they are to eat unleavened bread, because there is no time for it to rise; and they are to sacrifice a lamb and spread its blood on the doorposts of their houses. The blood of the sacrificed lamb will mark the inhabitants as members of the Covenant and so the Angel of Death will pass over them.

God sends a pillar of fire by night, and a pillar of smoke by day, to lead the Hebrews out of Egypt, through the Red Sea (or Sea of Reeds). God divides the waters to allow them to pass through on dry ground but then lets the waters flow back to drown the pursuing Egyptian army. After fifty days, Moses encounters God on Mount Sinai, and God gives him the Ten Commandments and then sends His own Spirit upon the elders of the tribes. These Commandments now spell out the requirements of the Covenant which bind them to God. In addition to circumcision, which was the sign of the covenant with Abraham, there now are three additional signs that these are God's own people: they are to observe kosher laws concerning food; they are to consecrate one day a week especially to God (the Sabbath); and they are to have a feast day each year (the Seder) to re-member their Exodus, when God rescued them from slavery, spared them from the Angel of Death, and led them to their Promised Land, which they would enter after forty years encamped at the edge of the desert where they ate manna from heaven.

You probably knew many of the details of the Exodus story. Perhaps setting them out helped you make some connections with our Christian experiences: deliverance from slavery/Christ's deliverance from slavery to sin and death/ the blood of the sacrificed lamb/ Jesus the Lamb of God, whose "blood of the new and eternal Covenant is poured out for the forgiveness of sins;" passing through the water of the Red Sea/the water of baptism; unleavened bread and then manna/the Eucharist; the Ten Commandments/ "I give you a New Commandment, Love one another;" the giving of the Law and the Spirit Fifty Days after Exodus (Pentecost)/the Pentecost event of the descent of the Holy Spirit fifty days after the Resurrection; the Promised Land of Canaan/the Promised Land of the Heavenly Kingdom.

We will explore more of this in two more installments.

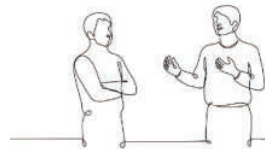

Stories that include a child or family member's journey of faith can provide examples of how everyone's relationship with Christ can be ever-growing and lifelong.

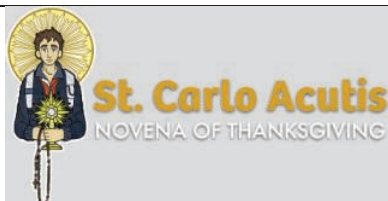


Trials and Tribulations

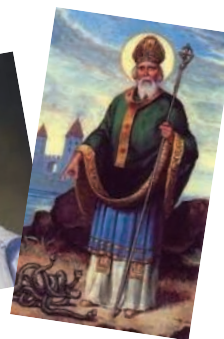
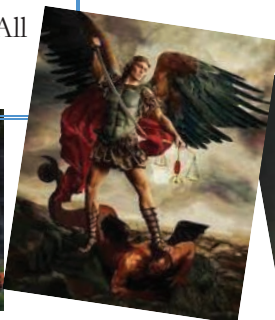

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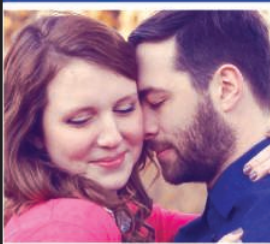
