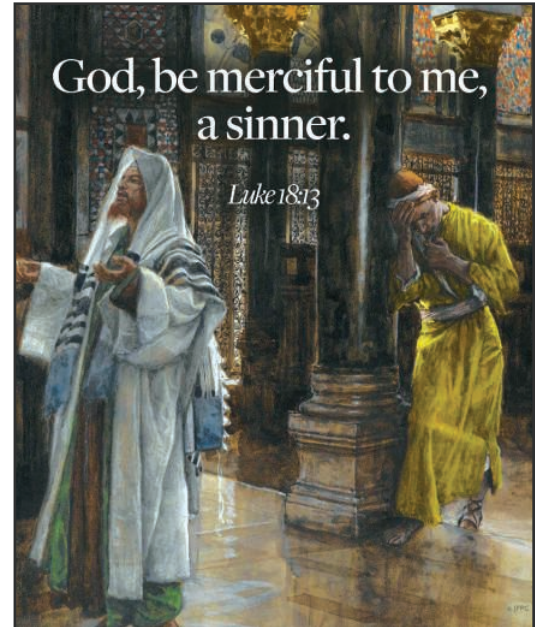

Pastor's Reflection

The last three weeks we've considered something of our Jewish roots: the Covenants, Exodus, and the Jewishness of Jesus. Understanding these three pillars is foundational to understanding our Eucharistic liturgy.

First, notice the use of the Hebrew Scriptures, including the psalms, in the Liturgy of the Word. A second century Christian tried to purge the Christian liturgy of any Jewish connections and was denounced as a heretic. Instead, consider briefly some words and phrases that echo our Jewish roots: Amen, Hosanna, Alleluia.

Amen means "yes" or "let it be so" or "I assent, I believe."

"Hosanna in the highest." Hosanna means "save us now God, who is in the highest heavens, with supreme authority." It is an appeal for divine help but also a joyful declaration of praise that such help is at hand.

Alleluia is a cry of jubilation meaning 'Praise the Lord.' In the presence of the mystery of our redemption, our usual vocabulary is inadequate, and so we stammer in amazement like children, crying our alleluia of wonder and awe.

Consider some additional phrases from our Jewish heritage:

When placing the gifts of bread and wine on the altar, the presider says, "Blessed are you Lord God of all creation." This is the Baruch Ata Adonai, the standard opening of most Jewish prayers.

"Holy, Holy, Holy." Hebrew has not superlative form for adjectives, so repeating the word Holy is its way of saying Holiest or Most Holy. This is a quote from Isaiah's vision of the angels praising God in the temple. (Isaiah 6:3)

"Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." When the crowd greets Jesus with these words on his entry into Jerusalem, they are quoting Psalm 118.

The Last Supper of Jesus was a Passover Seder. There would have been a recitation of the Exodus events, together with blessings and songs, with a meal with unleavened bread, lamb, and four cups of wine. The command to celebrate the annual Passover Seder comes from Exodus 13:8. The annual Seder, together with the weekly Sabbath, the keeping of kosher food and dietary laws, and circumcision of males, are the signs of belonging to the Covenant with God commanded at Mt. Sinai.

Next week we will take a brief break from this series on our Jewish roots, to consider the feasts of All Saints, All Souls and the month of the dead. Then the November 8th bulletin reflection will conclude this series of five reflections with explicit connections between Exodus, Seder and Eucharist.

The Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

Since the prayers of the Rosary come from such excellent sources — from Our Lord Himself, from inspired Scripture, and from the Church — it is not surprising that the Rosary is so dear to our Blessed Mother and so powerful with heaven.

All Hallows' Eve: October 31

Occasionally Catholics have asked, should Catholics participate in Halloween festivities? - which the reply has been – no festivities of any kind are mandatory, so participation is up to oneself. But Catholics invented Halloween, so if it's appropriate for anyone, it's appropriate for us!

In fact, virtually all historical attacks on the celebration of Halloween have come about specifically because it was too Catholic. Halloween is All Hallows' Eve, the vigil of All Saints' Day, which was instituted as a feast by Pope Gregory II in the eighth century. Going door to door, collecting treats, and carving veggies into lanterns were all ancient Celtic traditions associated with the harvest, but the spookier side of Halloween was never occult or even pagan. It was all Catholic.

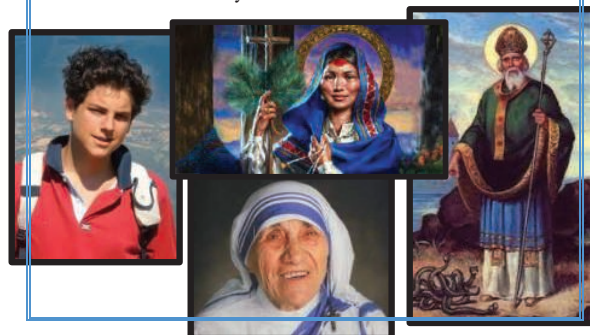

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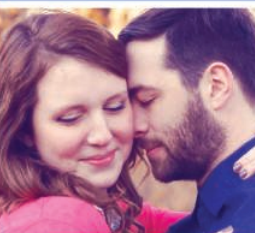
