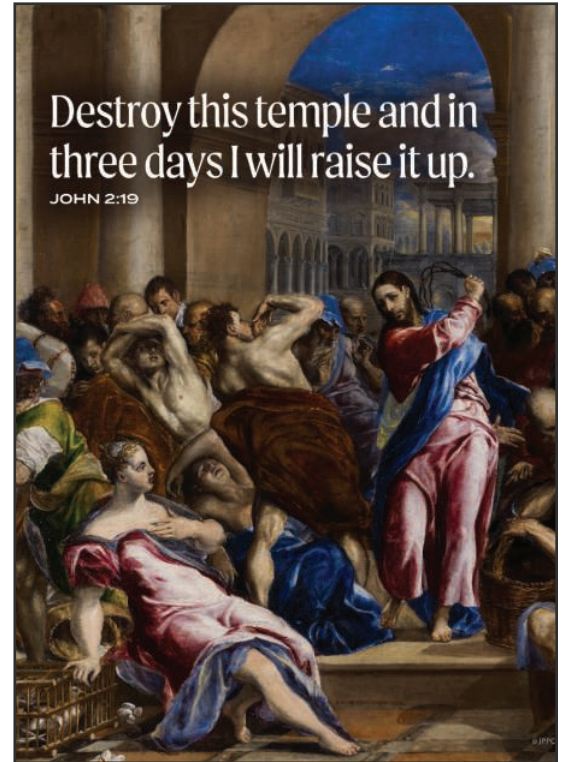

Pastor's Reflection

This week and next we will conclude this six-part series, begun on October 5, on the elements of Salvation History---Covenant, the Exodus event and the Jewishness of Jesus—that are fundamental to our understanding of Eucharist. If you haven't read the previous four installments, they can be found on our website, under Bulletin.

Today we examine the elements of the Last Supper as a Passover Seder. We will keep in mind the apparent discrepancy between the claim made in the Synoptic Gospels that Last Supper was on Passover, and John's assertion that Passover began that week on Friday, at the start of the Sabbath. Below, I'll suggest an altered chronology of Holy Week, to resolve that discrepancy.

Passover Seders require special preparations, and the Synoptics all describe Jesus' sending two disciples (Luke identifies them as Peter and John) into the city to make those preparations. Luke adds the intriguing detail that they will meet a man carrying a water jug, and they are to follow him to the place where they are to ready the Seder meal. Since carrying a water jug was considered "women's work," this might indicate that the man belonged to a celibate all-male community, i.e. the Essenes, who had a house in Jerusalem.

The Synoptics contain additional details that indicate the Last Supper indeed was a Passover Seder: the disciples and Jesus reclined at the meal; there is special attention to the four cups of wine, the fourth of which is taken up after the meal. The Seder is a "dipping meal," and Jesus dips a morsel and offers it to Judas. In retelling the story of the Exodus and the giving of the Law at Mt. Sinai, Jesus invoked the image of a "New Covenant," made, not in the blood of a the lamb that had been slaughtered for this meal, but in His Blood—and John's Gospel will remind its hearers that the first title bestowed on Jesus, by John the Baptist, was The Lamb of God. Finally, at the end of the meal, as they walk to Gethsemane, the disciples sing hymns, Psalms 115-118.

A couple of other apparently insignificant events in fact underscore the assertion that the Last Supper was a Passover Seder. First, part of the preparation for the feast was having a ritual bath, a Mikva. Jesus' words to Peter, in John's gospel, that the one who has bathed is clean all over, and only needs Jesus to wash his feet, perhaps hints at such a Mikva. Also, the tradition required that those who eat the Passover Seder in Jerusalem must stay in the city until the end of the festival. Jesus had spent the several evenings prior to the Last Supper in Bethany, which is outside the city; but at the conclusion of the Last Supper, instead of returning to Bethany, they decamp to the garden at Gethsemane, the farthest reaches of the city limits.

But John's gospel claims that Passover was a Sabbath, beginning at sundown Friday. The priests refuse to enter Pilate's palace lest they become ritually impure and thus be unable to eat the Passover feast; drawing of the imagery of Jesus as the Lamb of God, Jesus dies at the very hour when the lambs are being slaughtered at the temple; John declares that his bones are not broken; and just as the ritually slaughtered sacrificial lambs must have their blood drained, Jesus' blood is drained from his body when the spear pierces his side.

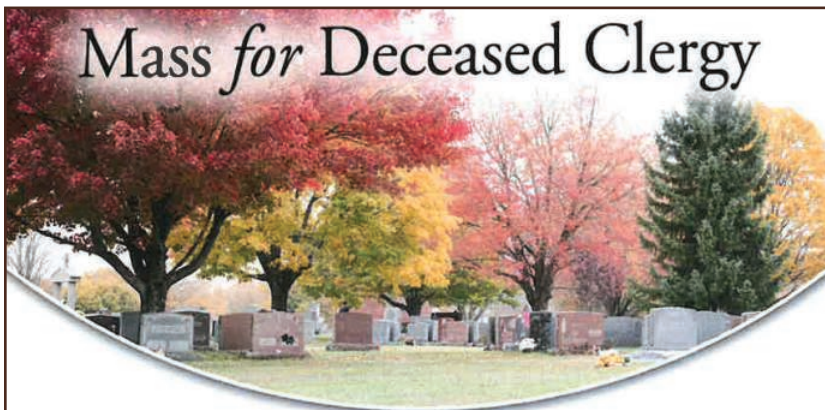
The gospels also draw upon additional elements of the Exodus story: the plague of darkness (three days in Exodus, three hours during the Crucifixion); the hyssop stick lifted to Jesus' lips (in the Exodus, the Israelites are commanded to dip the hyssop reed in the blood of the sacrificed lamb and daub the blood on the doorposts, so that the Angel of Death will pass over those so marked).

Pope Benedict acknowledged that the traditional Holy Week chronology of Thursday and Friday does not allow for enough time for all the elements of the Passion, and he suggested that the Last Supper occurred on Wednesday. In my presentations during Lent these past two years I posited that Tuesday better fits all the events. And, interestingly, the calendar of the Essene community from Qumran always celebrated Passover on Tuesday evening.

In sum: the Synoptics stress the Last Supper as the Passover Seder, now become the Eucharistic feast; John stresses the Crucifixion as the sacrifice of the Lamb of God, to deliver from death those marked by the Blood of the Sacrificed Lamb. Next week we will explore how at each Eucharist, we are present both at the Last Supper and at the Crucifixion, as well as in the Upper Room on Easter night and, anticipatorily, already at the Eternal Supper of the Lamb.

Silent Homilies

How little things can make a big difference in families where religion is transmitted successfully, sacred objects are powerful. Statues of saints and the Blessed Mother, candles near photos of deceased members of the family, crucifixes on the wall, pictures of Jesus knocking at the door – all these can serve as silent homilies for children. These types of objects send a sacred message and serve as reminders of God's continued presence in your life and home.

One such silent homily is the **Sacred Space**, which can be a home altar or sacred place is where one can take a moment to say a prayer, have a quiet thought, and remember departed loved ones. This space can include a crucifix, saint cards, candles, rosary beads, pictures, and small personal items of deceased family members. 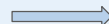

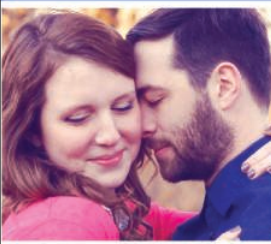
