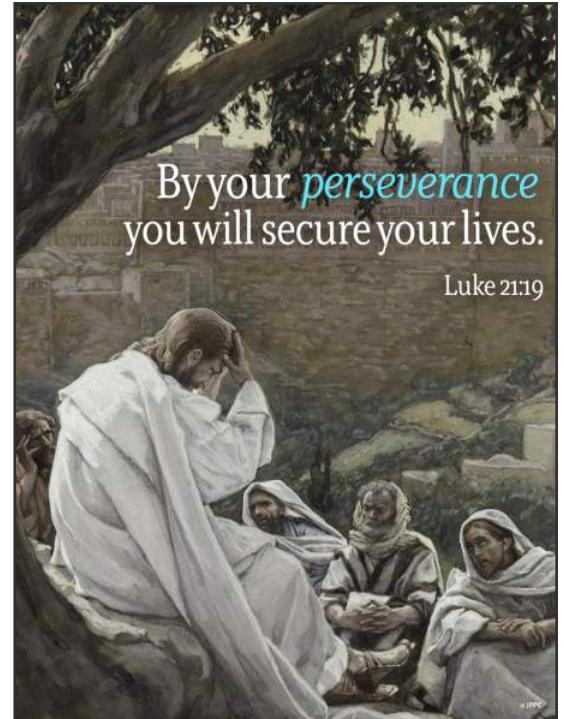

Pastor's Reflection

Today, the last of a six-part series on Eucharist and Salvation History: a deeper dive into Covenant, Exodus and the Jewishness of Jesus.

Last week we took a closer look at the twin inseparable elements of Eucharist as supper and as sacrifice. The Synoptic Gospels stress the Last Supper as a Passover Seder, at which Jesus, in retelling the Exodus story, makes a new covenant, now in his own blood. John underscores the Crucifixion as the Sacrifice of the Lamb of God, as Jesus dies at the very hour when the lambs are being ritually slaughtered at the Temple for that evening's Passover Seder.

To understand the Paschal Mystery of Christ and the Eucharist, it's essential to grasp that Eucharist is not just a "memorial" in the deficient English meaning of the word.

A Jew celebrating a Passover Seder states: "It is because of what the LORD did for me when I came out of Egypt." Each one celebrating the Passover experiences himself as a slave in Egypt and each one is led out by God and taken to the new country, the land promised in the Covenant God made with Abraham and his descendants. Each one personally is liberated from Egypt.

So too, at the Eucharist, we ourselves are not just recalling events of two thousand years ago. We are actually at the Last Supper itself; and not the priest but Jesus himself says the words, "This is My Body.... This is My Blood...." As one of the Eucharistic prayers declares, Jesus is present when we are gathered by his love, where, as for his first disciples, so now for us "He opens the scriptures and breaks the bread."

When Jesus blesses the bread, he retells the Passover story, breaks the bread and gives it to the disciples, saying "This (unleavened bread) is my Body which will be given/broken for you." When he blesses and passes the fourth cup, near the end of the meal, he says, "This is the cup of My blood, blood of the **new and eternal** Covenant, which will be poured out for you."

Then he parallels the Exodus command, "Do this in memory of (re-member) Me." That deficient translation more fully means, "and re-member me" i.e. member me anew, make me present anew, be my Body by eating and drinking my Blood.

The theological term for this is anamnesis. It means that the Eucharistic celebration is not just a passive recollection of events of long ago, but "re-membering with meaning in the power of the Spirit," such that we are really present at and participate in the events of Christ's passion, death and resurrection when we say and do what he commands.

Like Jews at Seder, we experience ourselves at the Last Supper with Jesus, and we hear him say, "This is my body; this is my blood." At the breaking of the bread (Agnus Dei/Lamb of God) we stand at the foot of the Cross as his Body is "broken" and his Blood is "poured out." Because Jesus himself is the sacrificed Lamb of God, we whom he has chosen as his own are marked by the blood of the sacrificed Lamb, and the Angel of Death will finally pass over us.

We are in the upper room on Easter night, when the Risen Lord appears to the frightened and guilty disciples and says, "Shalom, Peace," that is, "the Covenant is restored, right relationship with the Father and with me and with each other is repaired." And he breathes upon us the same Spirit and sends us forth to offer that same Shalom to our world.

And, *mirabile dictu*, when the church prays "Blessed are all those called to the Supper of the Lamb," we begin to glimpse that the Eucharist is a foretaste of that eternal banquet to which we are being called and welcomed.

In sum: as the Exodus Seder becomes the New Covenant supper, we are liberated from slavery to sin and death, led through the waters of baptism, fed on the manna of the Eucharist, marked by the Blood of the Sacrificed Lamb so that the Angel of Death will pass over us, receive the Spirit, now poured out on all humanity, in the new Pentecost, as we obey the New Commandment to love one another as He loves us, and are led to our promised home where Christ has prepared an eternal dwelling place with him.

Next week, Fr. Richard will reflect on Thanksgiving and the Feast of Christ the King, and then we begin Advent on November 30th.
