


#### The Prayer to St. Michael

#### **Eucharistic Adoration**

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is one of the great devotions of our Catholic tradition. All are welcome to come and spend time with Jesus truly present in the Eucharist for intimate prayer, to deepen their relationship with Him, and grow in the peace, wisdom and love He alone can provide. It is a blessing to spend time in adoration of Our Lord Jesus as He gives Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist.

Every Wednesday the Eucharist is placed prominently on the altar at St. Michael Church. This time of Adoration begins after the 9am Mass, continues throughout the day and concludes with Benediction at 8pm. While adorers may come and go as they wish, we are especially indebted to our committed adorers who ensure that as Pope Pius XII said, "the Most Holy Sacrament, when exposed must never be left unattended." #### **Sacrament of Baptism**

Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sundays.

If this is your first child, a baptism-prep class is required. Please contact the parish office to receive a Baptism Registration Form, Sponsor Forms and to make arrangements.



#### **Sacrament of Matrimony**

Ideally, arrangements for weddings should be made at least six months prior to the wedding date. Contact the parish office to make arrangements.

#### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Jesus came to heal the whole person, body and soul. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. Participation in the rites is also encouraged for those who are struggling with serious or chronic illness, those who face surgery due to serious illness, those who suffer serious emotional/mental illness and the elderly who are weakened, even though no notable illness is present. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.



#### Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is a welcoming program for gradually entering into the Catholic Church and completing the Sacraments. We invite you to look deeper into the Catholic faith.

It is a journey to learn how to live the Gospel values and the truths of our faith. We hold sessions to share what Catholics believe and the fellowship of our parish family through study, prayer, and rites at Masses. Participants are mentored throughout the process by a team of catechists and sponsors.

While generally planned as a multiple session conversation about the fundamental teaching of the Roman Catholic Church, the program can be flexible based on a person's prior experience participating in the liturgies with their family or acquiring this knowledge in other ways.

#### **Faith Formation**

Our Mission is to support the parents of the parish in helping their children grow in their understanding of our faith and deepen their relationship with our Lord. We encourage them to participate actively in the celebration of the Eucharist and the life of the parish and to take seriously the study of Scripture and sound Catholic doctrine.

#### Family Formation, Grades 1-6

This program puts emphasis on the role of parents as the first witnesses in the ways of faith. On the 1st and 3rd Sunday, parents and children stay after Mass to receive continued formation with the priest. The Family Formation Program provides the necessary preparation for First Penance and First Holy Communion.





#### **Confirmation Prep: 7th & 8th grades**

Candidates meet about twice a month for lessons, using the "Chosen" program & completing the textbook throughout the year. Each class is followed by the celebration of the Holy Mass. Before receiving Confirmation in the fall (9th grade), the candidates complete 10 hours of immediate preparation and attend a retreat which allows them to reflect on how to live out the commitment they make to Christ in Confirmation.



#### **Youth Group**

Our Youth Ministry provides an opportunity for teens to create exciting new ideas, challenges and spiritual connection, along with ways to give back to the community by volunteering their time and earning community service hours.


The Youth Group meets every 2nd and 4th Friday of the month.

#### Parish Ministries Altar Servers

Altar Servers are volunteers who generally serve at Mass on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings, or at other important liturgical celebrations during the year. Our Adult Choir has talented parishioners composed of High School students, working professionals, and Seniors who sing at the Sunday noon Mass from Autumn to Spring. There are also core professional cantors and Middle Schoolers who sing at select liturgies, including the Christmas Family Mass. Our Children's Chorus also rehearses to sing at several Family Masses. The hymns, solos, and instrumental offerings at our celebrations are diverse, and lift up our sung prayer at over 250 liturgies each year. Trained parish facilitators conduct the program. All meetings take place in an intimate, small group, and a confidential setting. #### **Governance**

#### The Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils

The main function of the Parish Pastoral Council is to foster greater participation by the entire parish in the pastoral life and mission of the parish.

The Council is a consultative body whose main role is advising and assisting the Pastor in developing a pastoral plan for the parish. And to that end, collaborates with the parish organizations and ministries that address specific areas of parish life such as worship, music, fellowship, spirituality, faith formation, evangelization, service, and finance. The Council meets at least 4 times per year.

The Parish Pastoral Council is separate and distinct from the Parish Finance Council. The Finance Council assists the pastor in financial planning, preparing operating and capital budgets, fundraising, and monitoring current revenues and expenditures. The two councils work closely together for the stability, vibrancy, and growth of parish life.
