


Music Capital Concerts

The Rector writes

A huge thank you to everyone who faithfully supported the Lenten Services. They were ably led by one of our readers, Alan Neely, and on the occasions that I was away, Sandra McConnell delivered the address. Thanks to the other readers too who read the scriptures and to Lauren for providing musical accompaniment for the hymns.

I'm sure you will agree that the usual Holy Thursday and Good Friday services were suitably poignant, and now we're in a whole new season of joy at the truth of the good news of the resurrection of Jesus.



As Lent came near an end, usually Palm Sunday is a slightly more up-beat service before the intensity of Holy Week. Of course, for us, Palm Sunday was quite a day indeed. We had a magnificent service which welcomed civic dignitaries, friends, guests, volunteers and Bishop Andrew gave a most inspiring sermon. At this service we received the King's Award for Volunteering.

What an historic moment in the life of the wee church! After the service we enjoyed a buffet lunch together, and it all seemed to go down a treat. Well done once again to all of our volunteers past and present, and here's to building upon the welcome our church is famed for.

At time of writing, the Easter General Vestry hasn't quite taken place yet, but I thank once again the outgoing members of the Select Vestry together with our principal officers and other supplemental officers. And on the other side of that same coin, I pray that anyone who will be nominated into new positions will be willing to serve in these various capacities.





Recently you may have heard that we have been successful in our funding application to provide much needed renovations to the cottage. A huge word of thanks to Alwyn Robinson, Drew White, Peter Kelly (consultant) and David Graham (architect) for their sterling work in securing this grant. There are a few hoops to go through both at diocesan level and at the RCB, however we hope we can successfully receive the necessary permissions to progress as soon as practicable.



The icing on the cake is that this generous funding should free up some of our own parish resources in order to progress some of the work we have been 'threatening' for the last little while — redecorating the main hall and treating some of the dampness in the hall corridors to name but a few. As all of this takes significant investment for future generations I would appeal for your continued generosity to the building fund.

Regarding our church finances, I offer a sincere word of thanks to our weekly 'counters' and to Drew White, Linda Allen and our auditors for their good financial governance over the past year. The Hon Treasurer will make his report at the Easter General Vestry, but a couple of headlines —

- We are very blessed to receive grant aid to renovate the cottage. Otherwise it
 would have to be sold off and the asset would be lost to us.
- The church is in a reasonably sound overall financial position in the short term.
- We need £7500 per month to operate as we are doing.

HOWEVER

- Since November 2024, weekly and monthly free-will offerings are lower than the equivalent period last year. This is an interesting statistic because, overall, attendances were higher.
- Out of about 180 households who receive envelopes <u>79</u> have not contributed anything. It goes without saying that this is a very worrying and unsustainable statistic which does not bode well for the long-term future. If you really want St. Augustine's to be in good shape for the next generation, then it's time to commit to it both through attendance and financial giving via the FWO and gift aid schemes.
- Please reinforce these key messages to any family members and friends who are currently not supporting their church as they might.

Finally, as part of this magazine, you will notice a little leaflet entitled 'Stepping out in faith together.' This leaflet gives a flavour of how the partnership with the Diocese of Kondoa is shaping up, and also provides some pointers on how we can help. I commend this to you.








LUMINARE PRESENTS






