Our school plan addresses the Emery School Board TSSA framework by focusing on Student Literacy, and Academic Support and Student Social/Mental Health and Well-Being.

Explain how TSSA funds will be used to advance your school's goals:

Under current estimations given by the Business Office, Castle Dale Elementary's allocated amount is \$35,971. This amount could change if the Business Office receives a different allotment than is expected.

TSSA funds will be used to fund:

1) Paraprofessional positions - (Approximately \$34,944)

These paraprofessionals will aid in instruction and intervention in literacy, mathematics, and other academic areas. This may include, but is not limited to BURST, Lexia Core5 and possible social emotional support time for students.

- 2) Funds remaining after salaries or additional funds will be used in the following areas.
 - Purchase/Replace current leveled and/or class sets of books Cost variable based on teacher need/request and where we can find the materials to be purchased.
 - Classroom Magazines For support of academic core subjects Magazines may
 include, but are not limited to, Kids Discover, Storyworks, Dynamath, Time For Kids,
 Scholastic News, Studies Weekly (Cost varies depending on the magazine.
 Subscriptions may start around \$5/student but could be lower or higher depending on
 the publisher and number of subscriptions needed.)
 - Science Supports This may include, but is not limited to, Mystery Science subscription, Mystery Science support kits (Cost - \$945 for subscription, Support kits vary in cost depending on grade level, but most range around \$500.)
 - Educational Software (If needed) If there are educational software needs that are not covered through other funding sources, they may be funded through this source. (Cost variable - Budgeted at \$1000)
 - Professional Development Opportunities Professional development opportunities
 arise at times and if faculty and staff express interest in attending (in person or virtual)
 we would like to be able to provide some funding for registration, travel, etc. Such
 opportunities may include UCET, Rural Schools, Solution Tree, Utah Systems
 Conference, and other available conferences. (Cost variable depending on registration
 and travel costs.)
 - Academic Incentives/Art Music Supplies As students make progress in Literacy and Mathematics incentives may be offered to encourage and reward students. Such incentives may include, but are not limited to: books, electronic devices, reward prizes, etc. Art and Music Supplies to supplement our shared art teacher. (Budgeted at \$250)
