

## January 15, 2026 - School Community Council Meeting - Minutes

Council Members In Attendance: Cari Guymon, Alison Daley, Melinda Durrant, Diane Jensen, Amanda Lawrence

Alison Daley made a motion to approve the minutes from 10/08/25. Amanda Lawrence seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Melinda Durrant gave information about expenditures for 2024-2025 school year. \$34,599.99 + \$1.08 carry-over from previous year. For the current year it is projected that there will be \$1.07 left. \$33,967 was budgeted for salaries and benefits and \$260 for software. The amount covers approximately 2.5 paraprofessional positions. K-1 are sharing an aide. Other classrooms have an aide for the morning.

Software covered included i-Ready, ST Math, Rocket Math, Lexia, etc.

Data review:

K-5 increased by an average of 22% from BOY to EOY in Acadience Reading.

K-5 increased by an average of 26% from BOY to EOY in Acadience Math

In RISE Grades 3-5 increased an average of 15% in ELA and 2% in Math.

Reasons for growth include better knowledge, more fidelity in instruction, and different interventions. Acadience results are closer to what teachers are seeing in class.

Public comment by Neal Peacock on Strategic Planning - Mastery Learning using 1-4. District determines base standards. UFA Scholarship - Students not to be served by the district if the families apply and take the money.

Public comment by Melissa Swasey with the PTO - Grown Ups and Goodies, more family activities, Art Show in the gym after PTSC in February.

Melinda Durrant shared that students would be celebrating 100 Days of School on Friday. 4th graders went to the state capitol.

It was expressed that it was felt there was a great climate at the school currently. Neal Peacock said, "The more parents see what you're doing the more support you have."

Alison motioned to adjourn the meeting. Amanda Lawrence seconded it. All were in favor.
