1. Job 19:1,23-27 - I know that my Redeemer lives

A reading from the Book of Job

Job answered and said:

Oh, would that my words were written down!

Would that they were inscribed in a record:

Hope does not disappoint us,

For while we were still weak,

at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person

though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die.

But God proves his love for us

in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Much more surely then,

now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God.

For if while we were enemies,

we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life.

But more than that,

we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

The reader acclaims: The Word of the Lord....

3. Romans 5:17-21 Where sin increased, grace abounded more

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

If, because of the one man's trespass,
death exercised dominion through that one,
much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace
and the free gift of righteousness
exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ.
Therefore, just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all,
so, one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all.
For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners,
so, by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.
But law came in, with the result that the trespass multiplied;
but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more,
so that, just as sin exercised dominion in death,
so, grace might also exercise dominion through justification
leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

4. Romans 6:3-9 Let us walk in newness of life

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

Therefore, we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin.

For whoever has died is freed from sin.

But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead,

will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

The reader acclaims: The Word of the Lord....

5. Romans 8:14-23 We groan while we wait for the redemption of bodies

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.

For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear,

but you have received a spirit of adoption.

When we cry, "Abba! Father!"

it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit

that we are children of God,

and if children, then heirs,

heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ

-- if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

I consider that the sufferings of this present time

are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us.

For the creation waits with eager longing

for the revealing of the children of God;

for the creation was subjected to futility,

not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it,

in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay

and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

We know that the whole creation

has been groaning in lab our pains until now;

and not only the creation, but we ourselves,

who have the first fruits of the Spirit,

groan inwardly while we wait for adoption,

the redemption of our bodies.

6. Romans 8:31b-39 Who can ever come between us and Christ's love

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

7. Romans 14:7-12 Whether alive or dead, we belong to the Lord

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves.

If we live, we live to the Lord,

and if we die, we die to the Lord;

so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's.

For to this end Christ died and lived again,

so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister?

Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister?

For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God.

For it is written.

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God."

So then, each of us will be accountable to God.

The reader acclaims: The Word of the Lord....

8. I Corinthians 15:20-28 All people will be brought to life in Christ

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being,

the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ.

But each in his own order:

Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ.

Then comes the end,

when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power.

For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet.

The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

For "God has put all things in subjection under his feet."

But when it says,

"All things are put in subjection,"
it is plain that this does not include the one
who put all things in subjection under him.
When all things are subjected to him,
then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one
who put all things in subjection under him,
so that God may be all in all.

The reader acclaims: The Word of the Lord....

9. I Corinthians 15:51-57 Death is swallowed up in victory

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Listen, I will tell you a mystery!

We will not all die, but we will all be changed,

in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.

For the trumpet will sound,

and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.

For this perishable body must put on imperishability,

and this mortal body must put on immortality.

When this perishable body puts on imperishability,

and this mortal body puts on immortality,

then the saying that is written will be fulfilled:

10. II Corinthians 4:14-5:1 What is unseen is eternal

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

We know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus,

and will bring us with you into his presence.

Yes, everything is for your sake,

so that grace, as it extends to more and more people,

may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart.

Even though our outer nature is wasting away,

our inner nature is being renewed day by day.

For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us

for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure,

because we look not at what can be seen

but at what cannot be seen;

for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

for we walk by faith, not by sight.

Yet we are courageous,

and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord.

Therefore, we aspire to please him,

whether we are at home or away.

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians

But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died,

so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope.

For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again,

even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died.

For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord,

that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord,

will by no means precede those who have died.

For the Lord himself, with a cry of command,

with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet,

will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first.

Then we who are alive, who are left,

will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air;

and so we will be with the Lord forever.

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David -- that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal.

But the word of God is not chained.

Therefore, I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.

The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us;

if we are faithless, he remains faithful - for he cannot deny himself.

and no one knows the Son except the Father,

and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me;

for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

3. Matthew 25:1-13 Look the bridegroom comes, go out to meet him

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

"The kingdom of heaven will be like this.

Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom.

Five of them were foolish, and five were wise.

When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps.

As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept.

But at midnight there was a shout,

"Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him."

Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps.

The foolish said to the wise,

And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came,

Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

4. Matthew 25:31-46 Come, you whom my Father has blessed

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory.

All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left.

Then the king will say to those at his right hand,

"Come, you that are blessed by my Father,

inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food,

I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink,

I was a stranger and you welcomed me,

I was naked and you gave me clothing,

I was sick and you took care of me,

I was in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him,

"Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink?

And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?

And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them,

"Truly I tell you,

just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family,

you did it to me.'

Then he will say to those at his left hand,

"You that are accursed,

depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry, and you gave me no food,

I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink,

I was a stranger, and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.'

Then they also will answer,

"Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?'

Then he will answer them,

"Truly I tell you,

just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.'

And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

5. Mark 15:33-39 Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

When it was noon,

darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon.

At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice,

"Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?"

which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

"Listen, he is calling for Elijah."

And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine,

put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink,

saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down."

Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

Now when the centurion, who stood facing him,

saw that in this way he breathed his last,

he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene,

and Mary the mother of James, and Salome

bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him.

And very early on the first day of the week,

when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb.

They had been saying to one another,

"Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?"

When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back.

As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed.

But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here.

Look, there is the place they laid him."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord. (all reply) Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

6. Luke 7:11-17 Young man, I say to you, rise

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd went with him.

As he approached the gate of the town, a man who had died was being carried out.

He was his mother's only son, and she was a widow; and with her was a large crowd from the town.

When the Lord saw her,

he had compassion for her and said to her, "Do not weep."

Then he came forward and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still.

And he said, "Young man, I say to you, rise!"

The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother.

Fear seized all of them;

and they glorified God, saying,

"A great prophet has risen among us!" and "God has looked favorably on his people!"

This word about him spread throughout Judea and all the surrounding country.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

7. Luke 12:35-40 Be prepared

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks.

Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them.

If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

"But know this:

if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into.

You also must be ready,

for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

8. Luke 23:33-43 Today you will be with me in paradise

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (23:33, 39-43)

When they came to the place that is called The Skull,

they crucified Jesus there with the criminals,

one on his right and one on his left.

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying,

"Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

But the other rebuked him, saying,

"Do you not fear God,

since you are under the same sentence of condemnation?

And we indeed have been condemned justly,

for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds,

but this man has done nothing wrong."

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

9. Luke 23:44-52 Father, I put my life in your hands

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

It was now about noon,

and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed;

and the curtain of the temple was torn in two.

Now there was a good and righteous man named Joseph.

This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus.

Then he took it down, wrapped it in a linen cloth,

and laid it in a rock-hewn tomb where no one had ever been laid.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn,

the women came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared.

found the stone rolled away from the tomb,

but when they went in, they did not find the body.

While they were perplexed about this,

suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them.

The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them.

"Why do you look for the living among the dead?

He is not here, but has risen.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

10. Luke 24:13-35 Christ should suffer so enter into his glory

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke (24:13-35)

Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem,

and talking with each other about all these things that had happened.

While they were talking and discussing,

Jesus himself came near and went with them,

but their eyes were kept from recognizing him.

And he said to them,

"What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?"

They stood still, looking sad.

Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him,

"Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem

who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?"

He asked them, "What things?"

They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth,

who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people,

and how our chief priests and leaders

handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him.

But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel.

Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place.

Moreover, some women of our group astounded us.

They were at the tomb early this morning,

and when they did not find his body there,

they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive.

Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him."

Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are,

and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared!

Was it not necessary that the Messiah

should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?"

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets,

he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

As they came near the village to which they were going,

he walked ahead as if he were going on.

But they urged him strongly, saying,

"Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over."

So he went in to stay with them.

When he was at the table with them,

he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them.

Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him;

and he vanished from their sight.

They said to each other,

"Were not our hearts burning within us

while he was talking to us on the road,

while he was opening the scriptures to us?"

That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem;

and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together.

They were saying,

"The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!"

Then they told what had happened on the road,

and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

11. John 5:24-29 Hears my word and believes has passed from death to life

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Very truly, I tell you,

anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment but has passed from death to life.

"Very truly, I tell you, the hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live.

For just as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself; and he has given him authority to execute judgment, because he is the Son of Man.

Do not be astonished at this;

for the hour is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and will come out

-- those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

12. John 6:37-40 I will raise them to life again on the last day

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away; for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me.

And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.

This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

13. John 6:51-58 I will raise them up on the last day

A reading from the holy gospel according to John (6:51-59)

I am the living bread that came down from heaven.

Whoever eats of this bread will live forever;

and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying,

"How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

So Jesus said to them.

"Very truly, I tell you,

unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day;

for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.

Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them.

Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father,

so whoever eats me will live because of me.

This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died.

But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

14. John 11:17-27 I am the resurrection and the life

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

When Jesus arrived,

he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days.

Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, some two miles away, and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them about their brother.

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, while Mary stayed at home.

Martha said to Jesus,

"Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.

But even now I know that God will give you whatever you ask of him." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."

Martha said to him,

"I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life.

Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.

Do you believe this?" She said to him,

"Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world."

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

15. John 11:32-45 Lazarus, come out

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

When Mary, the sister of Lazarus, came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him,

"Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping,

he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved.

He said, "Where have you laid him?"

They said to him, "Lord, come and see."

Jesus began to weep.

So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!"

But some of them said.

"Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man

have kept this man from dying?"

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb.

It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it.

Jesus said, "Take away the stone."

Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him,

"Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days."

Jesus said to her,

"Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So, they took away the stone.

And Jesus looked upward and said,

"Father, I thank you for having heard me.

I knew that you always hear me,

but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me."

When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!"

The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth.

Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

Many of the Jews therefore,

who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

(all reply) Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

16. John 12:23-38 If the grain falls and dies, it yields a rich harvest

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Jesus answered Andrew and Philip,

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

Very truly, I tell you,

unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies,

it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

Those who love their life lose it,

and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

Whoever serves me must follow me,

and where I am, there will my servant be also.

Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

"Now my soul is troubled.

And what should I say -- "Father, save me from this hour'?

No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name."

Then a voice came from heaven,

"I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."

The reader acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

17. John 14:1-6 There are many rooms in my Father's house

A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples,

"Do not let your hearts be troubled.

Believe in God, believe also in me.

In my Father's house there are many dwelling places.

If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?

And if I go and prepare a place for you,

I will come again and will take you to myself,

so that where I am, there you may be also.

And you know the way to the place where I am going."

Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going.

How can we know the way?"

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life.

No one comes to the Father except through me.

The celebrant acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

18. John 19:17-18, 25-39 And bowing his head he handed over his Spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

So they took Jesus, and, carrying the cross himself, he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha.

There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus in the middle.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene.

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son."

Then he said to the disciple,

"Behold, your mother."

And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.

After this, aware that everything was now finished, in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I thirst."

There was a vessel filled with common wine.

So they put a sponge soaked in wine on a sprig of hyssop and put it up to his mouth.

When Jesus had taken the wine, he said, "It is finished."

And bowing his head, he handed over the Spirit.

Now since it was preparation day,

in order that the bodies might not remain on the cross on the sabbath, for the sabbath day of that week was a solemn one, the Jews asked Pilate that their legs be broken and they be taken down.

So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and then of the other one who was crucified with Jesus.

But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs,

but one soldier thrust his lance into his side, and immediately Blood and water flowed out.

An eyewitness has testified, and his testimony is true; he knows that he is speaking the truth, so that you also may come to believe.

For this happened so that the Scripture passage might be fulfilled: Not a bone of it will be broken.

And again another passage says:

They will look upon him whom they have pierced.

After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the Body of Jesus.

And Pilate permitted it.

So he came and took his Body.

Nicodemus, the one who had first come to him at night, also came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes weighing about one hundred pounds.

The reader acclaims: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
