

Reminder to Parishioners to be on alert, and not fall victim, to ongoing scams that continue to surface at various parishes throughout the region from time-to-time.

Scams come in the form of malicious emails or text messages pretending to be from religious leaders or pastors. The scams themselves can take many variations from asking for a "favor," including asking you to purchase gift cards or asking you to send money.

We encourage you to call our parish office if there is ever a concern about any message you receive! Some other warning signs that might indicate a scam include:

Poor spelling or grammar in emails or text messages, Requests for you to provide personal information immediately, Requests that you provide monetary assistance immediately.

One of the most obvious red flags is the sender's email address – making sure it comes from a legitimate parish email.

Once again, if you are unsure about a text message or email you receive, do not respond. Call the parish office right away to notify our staff.

You can also report the scam to law enforcement and the Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant, which helps the FTC detect patterns of fraud and abuse by going to https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
