

All who are seriously sick, hospitalized, or having surgery can receive this sacrament.


Please call the parish office if you wish to be anointed.



In this season of renewal, Catholics are invited to experience

Christ's healing love through the Sacrament of Reconciliation as an important dimension of the Lenten journey. The website, www.dioceseofscranton.org/light has materials to assist you in preparing to make a good confession, prayers you may find helpful, and answers to frequently asked questions. Please make plans to come on a Lenten Monday, and spread the word of this special outreach of mercy to those you know!

Covid Safety Updates: Masks are not required for Mass but any parishioner is welcome to wear one any time.

The faithful are encouraged to be familiar with the level of COVID-19 transmission in their community and make an informed decision on what is best for them.

- -Individuals who are at high risk for severe illness should talk to their healthcare provider to discuss their activities.
- -Any individual with symptoms, a positive test or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention.
- -People are asked to be respectful of a person's choice to wear/not wear a face covering or mask in churches throughout the Diocese of Scranton.
- -Simply as a practice of good hygiene rather than a pandemic protocol, Priests, Deacons and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are encouraged to continue washing or sanitizing their hands prior to the distribution of Holy Communion.
- -The Diocese of Scranton reinstated the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days on Sunday, August 15, 2021. However, by longstanding Church law, this obligation does not apply to those who are: sick, have a serious health risk, live in a household with those at risk, are primary caregivers to those at risk or have serious anxiety or concerns about being in a large-group setting due to COVID-19.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or you may contact them electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Vactim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).
