- -Receiving the bulletin via email earlier in the week to be able to see what is happening that weekend.
- -Not having to worry that you misplaced your physical bulletin...reference your digital copy at any time!
- -Never miss a bulletin if you are sick or away and cannot make it to church that week.
- -The ability to click on links that take you to additional information, webpages, or online applications etc. This enables us to share digital content that cannot be accessed in our bulletin.


