


September is Suicide Awareness Month

Sunday, September 18, 2022 at 12:15PM at the Cathedral of St. Peter, Scranton
Bishop Bambera will celebrate a Mass for Suicide Healing and Remembrance
The Mass will serve to remember loved ones lost to suicide, and to promote healing for those who grieve their passing. During the Mass, those attending will be invited to bring forward to the altar a flower, in remembrance of those lost. All are welcome. Registration is requested, but not required.

Suicide is a leading cause of death in the United States. It was responsible for nearly 46,000 deaths in 2020. This is about one death every 11 minutes.

Suicide rates in 2020 were 30% higher than in 2000.

Suicide affects all ages. In 2020, suicide was among the top 9 leading causes of death for people ages 10-64. Suicide was the second leading cause of death for people ages 10-14 and 25-34

Suicide and suicide attempts affect the health and well-being of friends, loved ones, co-workers, and the community.

When people die by suicide, their surviving family and friends may experience shock, anger, guilt, symptoms of depression or anxiety, and may even experience thoughts of suicide themselves.

Grief Support Ministry

Jesus said, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted" (Mt. 5:4).

The Cathedral of Saint Peter Parish will once again hold a Grief Support group program for people in our community who are grieving the loss of a loved one. In our community we are frequently reminded of the reality of Death, and of our Christian responsibility to offer some degree of comfort to those who mourn. Our Ministry is **not confined to** Parish members only and is available to anyone in the community who feels the need to participate in a Grief Ministry Program that offers spiritual as well as emotional support during the weeks, months or years following the death of a close family member or friend. The next Grief Support Group will meet weekly for 4 weeks starting on Wednesday, September 7 and ending on Wednesday, September 28, from 6:30 to 7:30 PM in the Diocesan Pastoral Center, 330 Wyoming Avenue (across the street from the Cathedral). 
Silver Circle

GRADES 6, 7, and 8: Students will be using GOOGLE CLASSROOM in addition to in-person instruction to guide students.


Your child's google classroom code can be found on the registration information packet mailed to you. For assistance please call the Parish office at 570-961-1549.

6th, 7th, and 8th grade students will also meet IN PERSON twice a month on the first and last Tuesday of every month in order to allow for questions and community connection. The first IN-PERSON meeting is on TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27th. Each in-person meeting will take place at Saint Clare School from 6-7:15 pm.

ARRIVAL & PICK-UP PROCEDURE: ALL students should enter through the FRONT door of St. Clare School. It is vital that this happens because there are cars in the back parking lot that are picking up their children from aftercare. Upon arrival on the first day of classes, please have your child indicate if they will be dismissed as a walker or car rider. At the end of CCD, walkers will be dismissed through the front door of Saint Clare's. All students that are car riders will be dismissed from the back door. Cars should arrive in the back of the building in a straight line. You will be asked who you are picking up and your child will be escorted to your car. The safety of our students is a top priority.

NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ABORTED CHILDREN

The 10th annual National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children will beheld on Saturday, Sept. 10 when pro-life Americans will honor the memory of the nearly 65 million unborn victims of abortion since its legalization in 1973. The event on 9/10 will include a Memorial Service for Victims of Abortion to be held at 11 a.m. at Mount Olivet Cemetery, 612 Mount Olivet Road, Carverton.

It will take place at Mount Olivet's Wyoming Valley Knights of Columbus "Tomb for the Unborn," located on the top of the hill on the cemetery grounds. During the memorial observance, the Rosary will be recited in remembrance of all aborted babies. All faithful are invited.
