

FROM THE CATECHISM

Was Mary Truly a Virgin? (Para 456-460)

Has the Church always professed the virginity of Jesus' mother, Mary? Yes, says the Catechism. From the very beginning, the Church has always maintained that Jesus came into the womb of the Blessed Mother solely by the power of the Holy Spirit, seeing the virginal conception the sign that it truly was the Son of God who came in a humanity like our own.



The gospels all make it clear that the virginal conception was something beyond human comprehension; a divine work as prophesied in Isaiah: "Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a son." Mary, according to the *Catechism*, remained a virgin her entire life. Jesus was her only physical Son, "but her spiritual motherhood extends to all

men whom indeed He came to save." -Peggy Stanton, DM



On Sunday, October 1, 2023, the Cathedral of Saint Peter Parish will sponsor its Second Annual Cash Bingo fundraiser at the Diocese of Scranton Pastoral Center, 330 Wyoming Avenue, Scranton. Doors will open at 1:00 p.m. and the first game will be at 2:00 p.m. You may reserve your seat today by purchasing a ticket for \$25.00 by phone: 570-344-7231 or www.stpeterscathedral.org.

A limited number of tickets will be available at the door on the day of the event for \$30.00. Admission ticket includes three playing cards for 20 regular games. Additional cards will be available for purchase for 20 regular games and for 4 Specials. Refreshments and light fare will be available for purchase. In addition, there will be 50/50 and variety basket raffles. Parking is available in the lot on the corner of Wyoming Avenue and Linden St. and handicap parking is available in the lot next to the Diocesan Pastor Center.

On **Monday, October 16**th the annual Pennsylvania March for Life will be held at the State Capitol in Harrisburg. The Diocese of Scranton is sponsoring a bus departing from the Scranton area and is encouraging *youth ministries, college students, and young families* to participate. Cost is \$30 per adult/student and \$25 for students – that includes motor coach transportation and driver gratuity. Pick up will be at 7:45am from the Diocesan Pastoral Center in Scranton, with the potential for another pick up in the Wilkes-Barre area.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or you may contact them electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).
