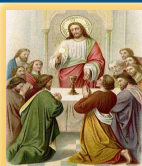

Special Collection Request

In view of the devastation caused by Hurricane Ian and Hurricane Fiona in the southeast United States starting in Florida, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, and Caribbean, many lives have been lost along with severe damage and destruction to properties. Catholic Charities USA and local agencies have provided humanitarian relief supplying food, water and sanitation assistance. Repair and rebuilding of homes will take place as soon as possible. A needs assessment has been made in contact with Bishops in impacted dioceses. To respond to this need, Archbishop Jose H. Gomez, President, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has suggested that a voluntary special collection be taken up as soon as possible for the humanitarian, long-term recovery, and significant Church needs arising from these disasters.

The collection will be sent to the USCCB Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund so that those most in need can receive assistance quickly. Funds will be used in response to the hurricanes and the impact of subsequent flooding and tornados and any other disasters that occur and will be distributed where they are most needed.

I thank you for your prayerful consideration and generous response to those in need.
