



## FROM THE CATECHISM

What Events of Jesus' Infancy Reveal (Para 527-530)

What do the revealed events of Jesus' infancy signify?

According to the *Catechism*,

Jesus' circumcision signals His
incorporation into the people of the covenant,

Abraham's descendants.

The Epiphany portrays Jesus as the Messiah, the Savior of all people. The Magi arriving from different lands

indicate the Gospel will spread to all peoples, but that they must turn toward the Jews and the Messianic message contained in the Old Testament.

The presentation in the Temple reveals Jesus to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord.

Simeon's prediction of a sword that will pierce Mary's heart is a prophecy of the oblation of the Cross.

The flight into Egypt and the slaughter of the innocents display the opposition of the darkness to the light. -Peggy Stanton, DM





Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or you may contact them electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).
