


With increasing demands, and larger weekly number of clients,

## FROM THE CATECHISM The Salvific Significance of Jesus' Hidden Life

What is the value of Jesus' hidden life in Nazareth? The Catechism points out, "During the greater part of His life Jesus shared the condition of the vast majority of human beings: a daily life spent without evident greatness, a life of manual labor" as a carpenter.

Jesus' obedience to His earthly parents fulfills the Fourth Commandment perfectly and forms a temporal image of His obedience to His heavenly Father. Through this obedience, He already began His work of restoring the damage done by Adam's disobedience.

This humble period also binds us to Jesus in the ordinary events of our lives. The "school of Nazareth" teaches us three things: the value of silence, the value of family life, and the value of work. -Peggy Stanton, DM

Our Faith teaches us that death is not an end. but a new beginning.


We call to mind our own mortality as we pray for those who are in need of our prayers, including the souls in Purgatory.
