FROM THE CATECHISM

The Drama at the Jordan (Para 535-536)


Can you imagine the scene at the river Jordan when Jesus was baptized? Here is John the Baptist baptizing the whole crowd of sinners, and suddenly, there in the midst of them, stands the Sinless One. John hesitates, but Jesus insists. The Holy Spirit in the form of a dove comes to rest over Jesus' head and the voice of the Father is heard from the heavens, proclaiming,

"This is My Beloved Son". The *Catechism* says, "the baptism of Jesus is on His part the acceptance and inauguration of His

mission as God's suffering Servant." Jesus accepts the Baptism and mission that will culminate on the Cross. "At His baptism 'the heavens were open'

- the heavens that Adam's sin had closed- and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation," the Catechism states. Christ is the second Adam.
