

FROM THE CATECHISM Who Forgives Our Sins? (Para 1441-1445)

When we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and hear that our sins are forgiven, do we realize that it is actually God forgiving our sins? "Only God forgives sins," the *Catechism* asserts.

But as the Son of God, Jesus shared His divine authority with His apostles, and gave them the power to forgive sins.

"Christ has willed that in her prayer and life and action His whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation." says the Catechism. Jesus not only forgives sins, He integrated the sinner into the company of the people of God."

"A remarkable sign of this", states the *Catechism*, is the fact that Jesus receives sinner at His table, a gesture that expresses in an astonishing way both God's forgiveness and a return to the bosom of the People of God." The power to forgive sins was expressed in the power that Jesus Bestowed on Simon Peter, when He gave Peter the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven -Peggy Stanton, DM



OPLATKI- Christmas Wafer

Many Slavic homes celebrate the tradition of the Christmas Wafer.
On Christmas Eve the family joins in a supper of special foods with the highlight of the meal being the breaking and distribution of the wafer bread to each other. It is a sign of love and friendship that is especially appropriate at Christmas time. The offering is \$3.00 per envelope.
Oplatki will be in the back of the church or at the rectory.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or you may contact them electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).
