"Then he said to them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared!"" Luke 24:25

This verse comes from the Emmaus Road passage. The story is one of the many resurrection appearance stories in scripture. As I was reading the text, it stood out to me the reason Cleopas and the unnamed individual did not recognize Jesus. In verse 25, Jesus says, "How foolish you are, how slow of hearts to believe." They didn't recognize Jesus because they didn't believe in their heart all that had been spoken and written about Jesus. Jesus begins to unpack the Old Testament, starting with Moses. In verse 27, we read, "Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures." It would be in the breaking of bread that they would recognize Jesus.

As I said earlier, many stories of Jesus' resurrection appearances are found in the Bible. We read these and think, wow, that sounds amazing; or what were they thinking about not being able to recognize Jesus, or how could Thomas doubt the witness of those he had spent so much time with? In their human minds, they were lacking a spiritual dimension. Jesus comes and opens their eyes; Jesus comes and says, *"touch my hands and my side."* As we read in Luke 24, Jesus breaks the bread, and they recognize him.

Lord, where are you now? Lord, reveal yourself to me. Lord, let me see you the way the women at the tomb, the disciples in the upper room, and the two men on the road to Emmaus have seen you. A famous chorus says, "Open our eves, Lord; we want to see Jesus, to reach out and touch him, and say that we love him. Open our ears, Lord, and help us to listen. Open our eves, Lord; we want to see Jesus." We all want to see Jesus and have the experience that the early disciples and followers had in those days following his death and resurrection. The reality is that Jesus is here. As the Gaither Vocal Band sings, "He is here, Hallelujah! He is here, Amen! He is here, Holy, Holy. I will bless His name again. He is here; listen closely. Hear Him calling out your name. He is here; you can touch Him. You will never be the same.' Blessings, Pastor Matt pastor@fmcnc.org

First Church Music Corner

Dear Church Family,

Back in February, the staff of First Methodist had the privilege of attending the New Room Leaders Gathering conference. During some of the main sessions and very much in the worship leaders' sessions, a lot of discussion and emphasis was placed on the two concepts of **consecration** *before* worship and **lingering** *during* worship.

The idea of **consecration** expresses the idea of being "set apart." This can happen through prayer and by surrendering one's self to God's purposes, releasing fear, anxiety, and ego, as well as confessing sin and shedding self-focused goals (for more in this check out the free pamphlet from seedbed.org entitled "How to Lead Worship for Encounter With Jesus"). At the conference, several of the worship leaders described lingering in worship as times that are "unrushed" or "spacious." These are times to truly just bask in God's presence.

In mulling over these two concepts during and after the conference I was reminded that the musical **prelude** that is played at the beginning of our Sunday times of worship helps to facilitate both a sense of **consecration** and **lingering**. During this time, the instrumental music is often reflective and contemplative. This is not a time to focus on the music or musicians, but rather the music serves to help draw us into a time of reflection, meditation, confession, prayer, and a readying of ourselves to worship God. It is a time when we can prepare our hearts and minds to be receptive to what God may have to say to us. It can be a time when we read over the scripture verses for the service or even pray for our church and community as we prepare to worship corporately. It's also a time to lay down the burdens of the week and let go of anything that may be clouding our hearts and minds as we seek to focus on Him.

Please consider being more intentional during the time of worship when the prelude is being played. Perhaps consider limiting conversation that is unrelated to worship. Take advantage of those five or so minutes to just be still and prepare for worship. As one of my favorite hymns states:

Jesus, the very thought of Thee

With Sweetness fills my breast: But sweeter far Thy face to see

And in Thy presence rest.

An article entitled "Prelude Talk" found on the website umcdiscipleship.org, discusses many of the challenges of the prelude/gathering time of worship and presents many suggestions for helping make this a more intentional time. Your time to serve...

It is time to begin praying over the leadership positions of our church and who will serve in the various ministry areas of the church. To help us in that prayerful discernment, I briefly describe each ministry team here at First Methodist and the leadership roles for each team.

Board of Trustees: The Trustees of First Methodist Church are entrusted to care for and maintain what God has provided for us here. They oversee the buildings and the maintenance needs of all physical property. The Board of Trustees chair is elected yearly from within the board. If you wish to serve on the Board of Trustees, please contact Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, you may also see the *Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 346.

SPRC (Staff Parish Relations Team): The Staff Parish Relations team is a ministry team that cares for and partners with our staff. They serve a vital role in checking in with the staff, addressing staffing concerns, evaluating both pastor and staff and filling any vacancies as they open. The SPRC also, in consultation with the Finance team, establishes the salaries and benefits for the pastor and staff. If you wish to serve on the SPRC Team, please get in touch with Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 345.

Finance Team: The Finance Team shall oversee the stewardship of financial resources as their priority throughout the year, seeking as part of the ministry of discipleship to move members toward tithing and beyond, with an attitude of generosity (Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline paragraph 347.2). The finance team looks at the church's financial practices and ensures that we are being good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. If you wish to serve on the Finance Team, please contact Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 347.

Nominations Team: This team works each year to discern who God may call to leadership in the local church. They seek to discern the gifts and graces each member has to serve and where they might best serve in the church's life. The team seeks to prayerfully discern the right person for a role, not just a warm body to fill a seat. Someone recently said, "Don't bring people on your team to fill roles. Bring people on your team because they are the people you believe God is calling to your team to be family." If you wish to serve on the Nominations Team, please get in touch with Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 344.

Lay Leader: The Lay Leader serves as the bridge between the pastor and the church's laity. The Lay Leader will have a pulse on the congregation and can relay that to the pastor and relay the pastor's pulse to the congregation. They serve as members of many church ministry teams, offering the congregation's thoughts in those places. If you wish to serve as the Church Lay Leader, please contact Pastor Matt for more details.
