### PASTOR'S CORNER

'I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. Isaiah 43:19

A few weeks ago, Pastor Joel and I were discussing the August sermon series, and he mentioned the word "Transitions." That resonated with me because this month, in my family, we are facing some significant transitions. The first thing that I had been mentally preparing for was the fact that Jackson was moving from 5th grade to 6th grade. The fact that he is a centimeter taller than I is hard enough; now I have to deal with the fact that he is going to middle school. If he hasn't told you yet, he is going to Midway. She will be at Clement in the fall and Hargrove in the spring, while

taking online classes from ECU. We are excited for these seasons, but I must confess it is a bit overwhelming to wrap one's head around. Yet, I am reminded that God is doing a new thing, and these transitions are part of our lives for this season. God is in the midst of them all. Beginning August 10th, we will explore how to trust God in seasons of change. Our series, "*Transitions*" will explore how God goes before us, how God will carry us through unfamiliar places, and equip us for what's next. We will also examine how, in all seasons, changes may occur, but God is at work in them all.

You may know someone going through a life transition, or you may be facing your own. Join us and invite someone to journey with us as we remind ourselves that, in this season of school starting back, new routines being developed, familiar things fading, and new things beginning, God is with us and He will never leave us nor forsake us.

## First Church Music Corner

Dear Church Family,

The "Jukebox" song for July 27 th was "Ancient Words" by Michael W. Smith. For the sermon about that song, Pastor Matt asked folks from the congregation to submit "words" from the Word that had particularly impacted them. As difficult as it was to pick just one passage of scripture, a passage that has become a sort of "theme verse" for our family is Philippians 4:8-9. This passage states:

"Finally, Brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy- meditate on these things. The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you."

Considering both this passage of scripture and the song "Ancient Words" made me think about the hymn "Wonderful Words of Life" (OGRP No. 429). This hymn, written by Philip Bliss in 1874, begins with this desire: "Sing them over again to me, wonderful words of life; Let me more of their beauty see, wonderful words of life; words of life and beauty, teach me faith and duty. Beautiful words, wonderful words, wonderful words of life..." Not only are the "ancient words" of the Bible true, they are indeed beautiful.

The scripture passage from Philippians encourages Christians to meditate on things that are true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report. What embodies these virtues more than the words of the Bible? Nothing! As the hymn says, these words, these beautiful and life-giving words, teach us faith and duty. Singing the words of the Bible is a wonderful, beautiful, and effective way to teach, learn, and internalize the truths of our faith.

The options for what kind of music we listen to with our families on a daily basis are virtually infinite. However, as followers of Christ, we need to be especially mindful of the content of the music we are consuming. Is the music we are listening to true, noble, pure, lovely, etc.? Not everything we listen to needs to necessarily be "sacred" but it should not in any way hinder our walk with the Lord. Listening and singing music that focuses on the Word of God is definitely a great way to ensure that we are not exposing ourselves to themes and ideas that are dishonoring to God or could create stumbling blocks for ourselves and our families.

As we head into a new school year, don't neglect the singing of wonderful words with your family. By doing so, you will be internalizing Biblical truths through music. You will also be ensuring that your family will be listening/singing songs that align with Philippians 4:8.



### Your time to serve...

It is time to begin praying over the leadership positions of our church and who will serve in the various ministry areas of the church. To help us in that prayerful discernment, I briefly describe each ministry team here at First Methodist and the leadership roles for each team.

**Board of Trustees:** The Trustees of First Methodist Church are entrusted to care for and maintain what God has provided for us here. They oversee the buildings and the maintenance needs of all physical property. The Board of Trustees chair is elected yearly from within the board. If you wish to serve on the Board of Trustees, please contact Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, you may also see the *Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 446.

SPRC (Staff Parish Relations Team): The Staff Parish Relations team is a ministry team that cares for and partners with our staff. They serve a vital role in checking in with the staff, addressing staffing concerns, evaluating both pastor and staff and filling any vacancies as they open. The SPRC also, in consultation with the Finance Team, establishes the salaries and benefits for the pastor and staff. If you wish to serve on the SPRC Team, please get in touch with Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 445.

**Finance Team:** The Finance Team shall oversee the stewardship of financial resources as their priority throughout the year, seeking as part of the ministry of discipleship to move members toward tithing and beyond, with an attitude of generosity (*Book of Doctrine and Discipline* paragraph 447.2). The Finance Team looks at the church's financial practices and ensures that we are being good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. If you wish to serve on the Finance Team, please contact Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 447.

**Nominations Team:** This team works each year to discern who God may call to leadership in the local church. They seek to discern the gifts and graces each member has to serve and where they might best serve in the church's life. The team seeks to prayerfully discern the right person for a role, not just a warm body to fill a seat. Someone recently said, "Don't bring people on your team to fill roles. Bring people on your team because they are the people you believe God is calling to your team to be family." If you wish to serve on the Nominations Team, please get in touch with Pastor Matt for more details. For more information, see the *Book of Doctrine and Discipline*, paragraph 444.

**Stewardship Team:** Plans and carries out the yearly stewardship campaign. They prepare the list for the Stewardship Boxes and encourage members of the church to prayerfully consider their pledge to God and to the ministries of First Methodist each fall.

**NOW Team:** The Nurture Outreach Witness Team is the team that is responsible for planning and carrying out the various events and activities inside the walls of the church but also outside the walls of the church. From Wednesday Evening Fellowship to Community partnerships events the NOW team seeks to make the name of Jesus known and disciples of Jesus made.
