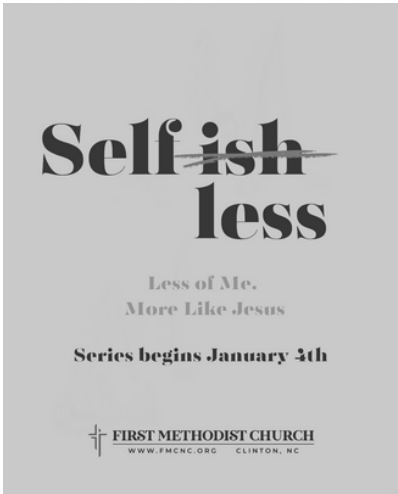

# A Letter From The Musicians

Dear Church Family,

This month we will begin rehearsing for an amazing event that some of us have lovingly dubbed “The Concert of Dan.” This concert is officially titled “Sing Praise to God”, after Mr. Dan’s favorite hymn of the same name. This rousing hymn (OGRP No. 5) is among the oldest hymns we sing on a regular basis. The text, originally written in German, dates to the mid-seventeenth century and was authored by Johann J. Schültz. It was later set to the tune Mit Freuden Zart (“With Great Personal Gladness”), which dates back to a 1566 Moravian hymnal. According to author Kenneth W. Osbeck, “this stately hymn is the product of several significant historical events occurring in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries which greatly shaped the course of church history.” He goes on to explain that these events included the Protestant Reformation, the Lutheran Pietism movement, and the Thirty Years’ War between the Catholic and Protestant churches (Osbeck, Kenneth W., 101 Hymn Stories. Grand Rapids, MI: Kregel Publications, 1982).

One of the most significant results of these events was an increase in personal holiness and dependence upon a sovereign God. This, in turn, led to a wealth of passionate hymnody. Verse one of “Sing Praise to God” declares:

“Sing praise to God who reigns above,  
The God of all creation, The God of power, the God of love, The God of our salvation. With healing balm my soul is filled And every faithless murmur stilled: To God all praise and glory.”

Each subsequent verse also ends with the phrase, “To God all praise and glory.” This declaration reminds us that our singing and worship are a response to the wondrous power and might of the Lord our God. When we sing praises to Him, we are giving Him praise and glory. Psalm 97:1 and 6 express it this way: “The Lord reigns, let the earth be glad; let the distant shores rejoice... The heavens proclaim His righteousness, and all the peoples see His glory.”

Mr. Dan has made a tremendous impact on the life, worship, and music of our church and community. For forty years, he has faithfully helped lead our congregation in giving God praise and glory through music. We hope that you will attend—and/or sing with us—in this concert celebrating his forty years of music ministry here at First Methodist. Rehearsals will take place in the sanctuary on **January 11, February 8, and March 8 at 3:00 p.m.** Please contact us if you have any questions or would like more information.

# Your 2026 Church Budget Narrative

Grace and peace to each of you. From the Finance Team, we are pleased to present our 2026 Operational Budget for First Methodist Church of Clinton, NC. Our budget is divided into three categories: Section 200 – Church Salaries, 200.1– Church Programs, Section 300 Church Operations. Through this narrative, I hope you will gain insight into some of the different components of this budget. First, know that this budget was not simply thrown together. Each ministry team leader and staff member prayerfully considered what they sensed God was calling them to do in the upcoming year and then what they felt they would need to carry out that vision. Second, Finance has done an excellent job of taking into consideration our giving history and pledge campaign results in preparing this budget. This budget is also a leap of faith budget. I invite everyone to prayerfully consider this budget and its approval. As we heard during our stewardship campaign, I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together. I love Jesus, I love this church, I love you, and I am excited to join in prayer with you over what we believe God is calling us to for 2026. With that, I invite you to also consider how we, as a community, might sense God calling each of us to take the same leap of faith in supporting the ministries of this church through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

### Section 200– Church Salaries

For the 2026 year, our total budget for church salaries is **\$363,166.00**. We are fortunate to have a great team of staff here at First Methodist Church. The increases in this line reflect the continued support of this staff through salary increases. With those increases comes an increase in what we pay to Social Security. With an upcoming Charge Conference, the Administrative Board must approve pastoral compensation of appointed pastors. In your packet for approval will be the documents as they will appear in the charge conference packet to approve the appointed pastor's salary for the year 2026.

### Section 200.1 Church Programs

Our church programming section for 2026 is **\$45,140.00**. Within this section, you will find our budget monies for youth ministry, children's ministry, VBS, Music, Missions, and SALT. A new line item this year is the Lay Member to the Annual Conference. With two appointed pastors, we can send two lay delegates to the annual conference. For 2025, the cost was just under \$1500. Considering the rising costs of hotels and food, \$2000 should cover those expenses.

### Section 300– Church Operations

Our church operations section for this year totals **\$126,531.00**, which is a key section of our budget. This section covers office supplies, utilities, and kitchen items, as well as cleaning products. One decrease you will see is postage. Thanks to those who indicated they were open to receiving the newsletter by email, we no longer need to mail out 150 newsletters. Our postage expenses have dropped significantly. Our insurance premiums increased this year, but our prayer is that by February, when the renewal comes, we will see a decrease in that number.

### Connectional Funding

Connectional Funding refers to the monies we send to the general church and the annual conference. This amount is determined by the amount of money we receive through tithes and offerings that go to support the mission and ministries of this church. We don't know what this number will be until after the last Sunday of the year, so our budget estimate is based on this uncertainty. Based on our current giving, our connectional funding will be at least **\$21,000**.

**The total budget for First Methodist Church for 2026 is \$555,837.00. We had pledged for 2026, \$460,766.00.**

Along with this budget are also some capital projects that the Trustees have considered for 2026.

### 1.Compressor for the Sanctuary units: \$11,000.00

Our sanctuary during the summer has been operating on a single AC unit. The unit that is currently out needs a compressor replaced. The hope is that this will get us up and running and take some stress off the one unit we currently have.

### 2. Parsonage Master Bath/Laundry Room Reno: \$40,000

Our family is blessed with a wonderful house that we get to make a home. The church has done a great job of maintaining this house and ensuring that everything is up to date and functioning correctly. As with anything, over time, some repairs and maintenance needs come up. The floors in the bathroom are slick, and if you hit them right, you go ice skating across the room. Given the age of the house and the restrooms, Trustees believe that when we remove the floor, we might uncover more than just a slick surface. This amount will enable trustees to redesign the space, making it more functional, and update some fixtures, as well as address necessary repairs.

### 3. Security Camera System: \$11,500

We all agree that the world we live in is not the world we grew up in. Security and safety are at the forefront of everyone's mind. SPRC requested that Trustees assess our camera system and add cameras to necessary rooms where children and youth are present, for the protection of those who God has entrusted to care for us, as well as for our volunteers. The trustees received a quote to replace three cameras that are currently not functioning to the standard they should be. The quote also includes an additional 16 cameras to cover areas where we currently do not have coverage, as well as to enhance the visibility in some rooms that we already have cameras in but cannot see well due to the camera's location or the room's size. This quote also includes an updated doorbell system for the main door of the church.

I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together. Together, with God's help we will see the kingdom of God continue to advance in Clinton thanks to your generosity and our ministry teams good stewardship of the funds which God has entrusted to us. A line by line budget will be emailed and printed out in the coming weeks. To God be the glory!

Dear Church Family,

On December 15, 2025, the Administrative Board approved a motion to bring before the congregation a vote on whether we should pursue the property next door, known as the Bell Property. That motion passed by a vote of 13–3.  
In order to help our congregation make the most informed and prayerful decision possible, we will offer two question-and-answer sessions:

**Thursday, January 8, 2026, at 6:30 p.m.**  
**Sunday, January 11, 2026, at 4:00 p.m.**

During these sessions, Trustee Chair Phillip Andrews will share a presentation explaining how this opportunity came about and will respond to questions raised by the Administrative Board and others.

The Bell Property is located directly next to our current parking lot and consists of two parcels of land. One parcel is 0.47 acres, and the second is 0.14 acres. We currently lease the smaller parcel for bus parking at a cost of \$100.00 per year.  
At a date to be determined in the coming weeks, we will hold a Church Conference, during which every professing member of First Methodist Church will have the opportunity to vote yes or no on whether to spend \$30,000 to enter into a three-year option with the current owners of the property. This option would give us time to prayerfully explore and discern the best plan for our church and the future needs of First Methodist.

First Methodist Church has a long history of faithfully responding to the needs of all generations. Once again, we are asking you to help us seek God’s wisdom as we consider this important decision. Our focus for 2026 is “I am the church; you are the church; we are the church together,” and we invite you to be part of this discernment as we seek ways to best serve the Lord and all of God’s children in our community.

Please prayerfully consider the future of our church, plan to attend one of the information sessions, and be present for the upcoming Church Conference. Above all, pray without ceasing for God’s guidance as we seek to make disciples here in Clinton, North Carolina.
