PASTOR'S CORNER


As I write this article, I notice a lot of preparation going on around me in different areas of life. In the church, we

First Church Music Corner

Dear Church Family,

"Since Jesus came into my heart,
Since Jesus came into my heart,
Floods of joy o'er my soul like the sea billows roll,
Since Jesus came into my heart."

A few weeks ago you may remember that we sang the hymn "Since Jesus Came into My Heart" (no. 552). This hymn speaks of the joy we have in knowing Christ. This is a good reason to sing out!

This hymn was written by Rufus H. McDaniel. According to the book "The Singers and Their Songs", McDaniel was ordained in the Christian church in 1873. He found much joy in church music. He began writing hymns in the 1880s. He wrote, "I feel in my soul that God has something for me to do in brightening the experience of struggling souls. My chief desire is to be a blessing, if possible, to my fellow-men through these hymns and thereby glorify God in the name of his dear son 'whose I am and whom I serve."

Amazingly, the lyrics to this hymn were penned just a year after McDaniel tragically lost his youngest son. What a testimony and an example! The text of this hymn affirms that when we consider our salvation through Jesus Christ, there is a joy that is beyond worldly comprehension. Even in the midst of great sorrow, grieving, and loss, we, as Christians, can sing with the joy of resurrection power. The last stanza of the hymn looks forward to the happiness of an eternity spent in heaven for those who believe and have Jesus in their hearts.

"I shall go there to dwell in that city, I know, Since Jesus came into my heart! And I'm happy, so happy, as onward I go, Since Jesus came into my heart!"

As we continue to reflect on Christ's Resurrection this season, let us try and sing with the happiness and joy that only He can provide.

"While we were still weak, at the right moment, Christ died for ungodly people. It isn't often that someone will die for a righteous person, though maybe someone might dare to die for a good person. But God shows his love for us, because while we were still sinners Christ died for us." Romans 5:6-8 CEB

Whether we are at home, a friend's house, or at a restaurant, when we sit at a table, we eat. So, the obvious thing to do when we come to Christ's table is eat. When we eat at Christ's table we Experience Atonement and Transformation. Before we dive into the E.A.T. acronym, we need to understand what the table is and how we approach it.

At Christ's table, there is always a seat open for any seeking salvation and a relationship with God. All of the seats are the same, there is no seat better than the other. It is where atonement for sin is found and the beginning to a new life for some and the continuance of a new life for others occurs. When approaching this table, we have to recognize the sin in our lives. This is spiritual hunger. The way that this hunger is filled is through salvation in Jesus Christ. When we recognize the need of atonement for our sin through Christ, then we are able to sit and eat.

When we come to the table, we experience atonement. Atonement is reparation for the sin, the wrong, we have done against God. When Christ died on the cross, he made atonement for the sin of all the world creating the way to be right with God. Although the atonement for sin is available to us, we have to receive that atonement. The physical practice of this is through the receiving of the bread and juice in communion.

It is through atonement that we experience transformation. We begin to recognize that when Christ was crucified on the cross, our sinful nature was crucified with him. It is Christ who now lives and it is we who have died. (Galatians 2:20) We are transformed from the sinful person that sat down at the table into Christ who now leaves the table and goes into the world. As a recipient of grace, we now share grace through compelled service to those who are coming to the table.

Come to the table and E.A.T. Experience Atoning Transformation. Sit at the table often for it is Christ who quenches our spiritual hunger. When you get up from the table, serve others remembering that there is space at the table for all those who seek forgiveness from sin. May the grace and love of our Lord fill you and give you peace. Amen.
