#### Celebrating Homecoming: A Legacy of Faith and a Future of Hope

Dear Church Family,

Our fall semester is well on its way! There are many exciting upcoming events coming up in the life of our church. On Sunday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate Homecoming with a worship service full of special music.

- ·The children (preschool-5<sup>th</sup> grade) will sing and the brass ensemble will play.
- •The dulcimer ensemble will be playing in worship on Sunday, October 26th.
- •The children will also sing in worship the first Sundays of November and December.
- ·The kids are also hard at work on their Christmas musical! This will be Wednesday, December 10<sup>th</sup>.
- ·We are preparing to host this year's Community Thanksgiving service. It will be held on the evening of November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

I would also like to share a bit about a wonderful learning opportunity I experienced last month. At the beginning of September, my eldest daughter Vivian and I attended one of the best conferences ever. The "Sing!" conference took place in Nashville, TN, and was themed "From Generation to Generation." It was a truly wonderful musical experience and one that I will remember for the rest of my life. I have a few highlights I would like to share with you. There were so many more things I wish I could mention, and if you would like to talk more about the conference, I'd love to share!

#### Monday, 9-1-2025

The first breakout of the day was a J.W. Pepper sing-along. It was wonderful to hear 300+ singers, in good voice singing through nearly an hour of wonderful new choir anthems.

The first plenary session was a concert to celebrate and introduce the new Sing! hymnal. In the full Ryman Auditorium, along with 7,000+ participants, the conference founders and hosts, Keith and Krystin Getty, explained the three goals for the hymnal. These goals were:

- 1.To publish great hymns of the faith.
- 2. Curate what we sing.
- 3. Build deeper, more biblical worship services.

#### Tuesday, 9-2-2025

The second day started with the second plenary session, which focused on hymns dealing with "the Christian Life". Most of the discussion was on the importance of instilling Christian faith into children and praying and singing with our families. The Sing! hymnal is ultimately meant to be on the family piano at home as well as in church pews. After the plenary session, Vivian and I went to a good, old-fashion hymn sing with 600+ people. The beauty of the sound was wonderful. I made sure to have my hymnal the entire time! In the evening, we got to experience a beautiful Christmas lessons and Carols service. Yes... in September!

#### Wednesday, 9-3-2025

Our final breakout session was about the importance of raising the next generation of musicians and how every skill and talent is needed by Christ for the church. There were quite a few suggestions including, but not limited to, whittling, cooking, dramatic reading, knitting, harmonica playing, painting, gardening, and even playing the mountain dulcimer! I couldn't write fast enough for all the examples, but the point was that everyone has something they can share with the next generation to use for the glory of God, and if they don't, those skills could be lost forever.

## **Missions Corner**




Throughout the month of October our Children's Ministry will be collecting socks for the homeless. Please drop off any new socks in the church office or with Ms. Abby
