

Home Meet Workers

Each DRSC Family participating in a Home Meet is required to provide one family member or suitable substitute to work at DR Home Meets. The number of required sessions will be specified at meet registration, and will generally be around 1-2 sessions. Meet workers must be sure to check in and check out with the Meet Coordinator on duty to receive proper credit for the session. It is possible to provide multiple workers at a single session to meet this requirement.

To ensure that Home Meets are fully staffed and run successfully, all Raiders families will be assessed a service fee equivalent to \$50/session required (for instance, if 3 sessions are required, the assessed service fee will be \$150) at the time of meet registration. The assessed service fee will then be credited back to each family at a rate of \$50/session worked, up to the number of required sessions for the specific meet. In

the event that a family who has registered to swim in the meet cannot, for any reason participate in the meet, it is the responsibility of the member to inform the DRSC Office Administrator as soon as possible, to have the assessed service fees refunded for their meet working requirements. Meet registration fees, and any other applicable fees are generally non-refundable. Sessions worked beyond the minimum number of sessions required for a specific meet will count towards a family's Service Hour Requirement.

Home Meet Food and Monetary Donations

All the food used in the Hospitality Room serves our meet staff, coaches, visiting coaches, officiating crew, and other volunteers. It's a nice place for everyone to relax, eat lunch, or get refreshments during the course of the meet.



Away Meet Workers:

Often times, Host Teams will request assistance with running their swim meets. This usually involves requests for Timers, but may also include requests to provide support with other positions as well. In the event that a Host Team requests assistance, but does not levy specific requirements upon the Raiders, families which volunteer to assist at these meets will receive credit towards their family's Service Hour Requirements.

In the event that the provision of meet support is required of the Raiders (for instance, a certain number of Timers for JO's or Zones) these requirements will be considered mandatory for

participating Raider's families and credit towards Service Hour Requirements will not be given. Initially, families will be given the opportunity to volunteer for these positions, however; any unfilled slots prior to the meet will be assigned to participating Raider's families. Every effort will be made to assign these positions as fairly as possible. In the event that all positions are not filled prior to a particular meet, the Dayton Raiders will be forced to withdraw the team from that competition.

This policy is applicable only to Raiders-specific meet support requirements. It does not apply to Athlete-specific requirements, such as provision of Timers and lap counters for distance events, as these requirements are the responsibility of the participating athlete/family.
