INTRODUCTION

During the month of August 2025, New Birth Christian Ministries focused on Evangelism under the theme 'Go and Tell Somebody.' This series challenged us to live out the Great Commission by sharing the Gospel in our families, neighborhoods, schools, and communities.

This devotional study guide is designed to help you revisit the lessons, apply them personally, and reflect on how God is calling you to go and tell somebody about Jesus.

LESSON 1

Just Get Started

Text: Acts 8:26–40; Exodus 3:11

In the first week, we were reminded of Philip's obedience when the Spirit told him to go to the desert road. Even without all the details, Philip obeyed and encountered the Ethiopian eunuch, who came to salvation. The message was clear: evangelism begins with simple obedience.

Don't delay—delay leads to doubt.

Be ready for divine appointments that God sets up, even when they interrupt our plans.

Reflection Questions

1. Where in your life have you delayed obeying God's call?
2. What kept you from moving forward?
3. What 'desert road' might God be sending you to that doesn't make sense right now?
4. How can you prepare your heart to be ready for divine appointments?





LESSON 2

Lesson 2: Deliverance, Correction, and Repentance

Text: Acts 8:9–25; James 1:19

In week two, we studied the story of Simon the sorcerer. His conversion showed us that deliverance is often a process. Evangelism doesn't stop at conversion—it requires discipleship and sometimes loving correction. Peter corrected Simon firmly, reminding us that correction is necessary for growth.

Finally, true evangelism requires listening—both to people and to the Spirit—and repenting when our hearts are not right.

Reflection Questions

1. How have you experienced deliverance as an ongoing process in your walk with Christ?
2. How can you lovingly correct and also receive correction in your faith journey?
3. In what areas do you need to slow down, listen more, and repent?

LESSON 3

Lesson 3: Real Friends Share Jesus

Text: John 1:41–50

Week three highlighted the importance of sharing Jesus within our closest relationships. Andrew told his brother Simon about Jesus. Philip told his friend Nathanael. Real friends don't keep Jesus to themselves.

This week reminded us that God has prepared us through our backgrounds, experiences, and gifts to reach others. Our families need the Gospel, and our friendships are opportunities for eternal impact.

Reflection Questions

1. Who in your family needs to hear the Gospel? How can you share it with them in love?
2. Which friends in your life need you to invite them to 'come and see' Jesus?
3. How has your background or testimony prepared you to reach others?

LESSON 4

Lesson 4: Living on Mission

Text: John 4:1–30 (The Woman at the Well)

Although not always highlighted, the fourth week focused on Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman. She experienced transformation and immediately went to tell her entire village about Jesus.

Evangelism is not reserved for the perfect or the well-studied—it is the overflow of encountering Christ. Every believer is called to live on mission, using their story as a testimony of God's grace.

Reflection Questions

1. How can your personal testimony impact your community?
2. What fears hold you back from sharing Jesus openly?
3. What would it look like for you to live each day with an evangelistic mindset?

LESSON 5

Lesson 5: Wait for the Yes, Be the Church, Live Holy

Text: Acts 16:11–15; Matthew 28:19

In the final week, Paul’s missionary journey reminded us to wait until the Spirit says yes. We cannot operate on our own agendas but must yield to God’s timing and direction.

We were also reminded that we are the Church—not just a building, but living temples where God’s Spirit dwells. Finally, our greatest witness is a holy life, set apart for God. Our testimony is strengthened not by words alone, but by a lifestyle that reflects Christ.

Reflection Questions

1. How can you make more room for the Holy Spirit in your plans?
2. In what ways can you carry the presence of Christ beyond the church building?
3. What habits or attitudes do you need to surrender to live a holy life?

The call to evangelism is not just for pastors or leaders—it is for every believer. Through these five weeks, we have learned to start where we are, trust God’s timing, share Jesus with family and friends, live on mission, and let our lives reflect holiness.
