

SAPA'S JOURNEY

In 2011, SAPA was formed to address substance abuse in Cascade County, with Alliance for Youth leading the coalition and serving as its fiscal agent. In 2017, Alliance for Youth secured a federal Block Grant to hire a full-time prevention specialist, advancing SAPA's mission to implement primary universal substance abuse prevention —an upstream approach that targets risks before problems start.

Today, the need for this prevention remains urgent, but funding is declining. This gap threatens SAPA's progress and highlights the need for renewed investment in Cascade County's health and well-being. Citizens from all sectors are encouraged to join SAPA's efforts and help build a healthier community.
