

The Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ

The feast of the Epiphany of our Lord is traditionally celebrated on January 6, but here in the United States, the Bishops Conference has the permission to celebrate on the Sunday closest to January 6th and after the Feast of the Holy Family. This feast of Epiphany manifests Christ as the light of the nations, fulfilling ancient prophecies and inaugurating the universal call to salvation. In salvation history, the Magi's journey from the East – guided by a star brighter than earthly powers – marks the transition from Christ's revelation to Israel (shepherds at Bethlehem) to all peoples, as Isaiah foretold: "Nations shall come to your light" (Is 60:3). This epiphany, or "manifestation," reveals the Messiah not in Herod's palace but in a humble stable, where the Wise Men adore the newborn King, offering gold for kingship, frankincense for divinity, and myrrh for redemptive suffering.

The Epiphany illuminates the path of faith and reason, the "two wings" lifting humanity to God. The star symbolizes Christ's grace drawing seekers amid trials – like Herod's deceit – urging perseverance in the pilgrimage of life. As Pope Benedict XVI

taught, the Magi embody the Church of the Gentiles, a procession through history to the Child who is "the way, truth, and life" (John 14:6).

Today, amid secular shadows, Epiphany challenges Christians to be epiphanies of light. That is, we are all called to be evangelists – evangelize boldly, reject power games, and offer lives as gifts. Families exchange Epiphany blessings, parishes bless homes with chalk (20+C+M+B+26), fostering missionary zeal. In the year of the Jubilee of hope, Pope Francis highlights the star's brightness – love that consumes self for others – as the sole path to joy.

Let the Epiphany renew us in the way we treat the people in our families, places of work and schools, communities and Churches. May Christ's light shines forth in our lives as individual, families, and communities. Amen. *Fr. Peter Chineke*

Looking for a meaningful New Year's goal? Join us in committing to 10 Hail Mary's a day. Through daily prayer, we grow closer to God and lift our intentions together


