

Called to Intentional Discipleship

Intentional Disciples are called to share their time, talent and treasures in service to others. One way we can serve our Parish Community is by serving in any of our parish ministries.



Eucharistic Minister -- (Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion) – The Eucharistic Minister performs the extraordinary service of

sharing the presence of Christ with the parish community by assisting the priest and deacon with the distribution of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at Mass. They also assist in the ministry to the sick by taking the Holy Eucharist to those who cannot get to Church for Mass. Eucharistic Ministers will receive adequate training and a mandate from the Bishop so that they can serve in this ministry.

Lectors - Lectors serve the Parish Community by proclaiming the Readings at Mass. Lectors are asked to familiarize themselves with their respective readings during the week prior to their designated duty. They should pray over, read, and practice proclaiming the scriptures that they will be reading. A copy of the Workbook for Lectors is provided to each Lector to help in this preparation. Training will be provided.



Hospitality Ministers – Hospitality Ministers are often the first smiling face that someone sees when they enter our Church. Hospitality Ministers arrive 20 to



30 minutes before Mass. They serve as the official “greeters” of our parish. Their duties include opening doors, offering a friendly greeting, handing out books and assisting with collection of offerings and presentation of the gifts.

Sacristans – Sacristans assist the priest and deacon by preparing the wine, water and bread that will be used in the Eucharistic celebration and by putting them in their proper place before the start of Mass. The Sacristan ensures that the candles are lit and that all the lights are turned on. The Sacristan also checks to be sure that all the Servers, Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers are present and ready to serve their ministries. The sacristans should be at the Church 30 minutes before the start of Mass. Training is provided.



There will be updates about the sign-ups and training for these ministries later in August. Please think about them and choose one or two that appeals to you.



The object of the night will be to share in more depth our CHWC experience and to share what NCYC entails.


This will be a donation only event, so we will ask to only give what you feel comfortable. If that is nothing, that is fine too..... BUT come and listen and watch!
