First Sunday of Advent

HAPPY NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

The Season of Advent, one of the oldest liturgical observances in the Catholic Church, is a sacred time that blends HISTORY, HOPE, and HOLY expectation. Emerging as early as the 4th and 5th centuries, Advent was originally a period of preparation for the feast of Epiphany, marked by fasting and prayer. Over time, the Church deepened its understanding of this season as a four-week journey toward the mystery of the Incarnation. By the Middle Ages, Advent became firmly rooted as the solemn yet joyful preparation for Christmas, inviting the faithful into a rhythm of anticipation that mirrors Israel's centuries-long longing for the Messiah.

Advent is a season of watchfulness, echoing the scriptural cry, "Prepare the way of the Lord" (Isa 40:3). Its violet vestments recall both REPENTANCE and ROYALTY, pointing toward a King who comes in humility. The Advent wreath, with its growing light, symbolizes the dawning hope that breaks into the world's darkness through Christ, the "Light of the nations." Each candle – prophecy, Bethlehem, shepherds, and angels – draws us deeper into salvation history.

But Advent is not only about remembering Christ's first coming. It is also about awakening our hearts to His presence now and preparing for His return in glory. The season calls every child of God to slow down, reflect, and re-center life on God's promises. It invites us to cultivate longing, renew faith, and allow Christ to be born anew within us. Thus, Advent remains a profound spiritual pilgrimage: a journey from darkness to light, from waiting to fulfillment, and from promise to divine encounter.

As your pastor, I sincerely encourage you to begin this season of hope by going to CONFESSION and making a commitment to attend Masses every weekend and on Holy Days of Obligation throughout the new year that starts today.
