When 9/11 Happened!

The events of September 11, 2001, evoked a wide range of reactions from people of all races, languages, cultures, religions, and philosophies, cutting across all political divides. Both secular and religious organizations, as well as individuals, criticized the government and the military. Some focused on condemning the suspected terrorists and terrorist organizations, especially in the Middle East. Meanwhile, many resorted to blaming God and wondered why such a horror was allowed to befall his people. One notable reaction was the increased fear of death, which became more pronounced even among Christians (Catholics and non-Catholic followers of Christ) and other people of faith.

The fear of death, the fear of a horrible death, and the fear of a possible third world war, including the fear of a nuclear war, were all pervasive, extending beyond the United States. Following the incident, there was a massive increase in church attendance across all Christian churches in the country. Why? Although some people were actively blaming God, most sought reconciliation with Him. It was instantly realized that not even an advanced science and technology, a sophisticated military, or the most efficient and reliable government can save humanity from such man-made evils.

So, people thought that the safest thing to do was to go back to the church and have a

renewed relationship with God. How beautiful! However, we may need to reflect more on questions like these: Does God promise to take away wars? Did he ever promise to stop terrorisms before or after 9/11? Is God going to take away nuclear weapons from organizations and governments? Is he going to give us leaders who are willing to walk the talk of protecting human lives? After a deep reflection on these, I could hear God reminding us of his words in Matthew 6:33 "Seek first the kingdom of God, and every other thing shall be taken care of." Now, the question for us is, how do we seek the kingdom of God and trust that He will take care of our worldly concerns and anxieties? Let us reflect on this both as individuals and families this week.

May the souls of those who lost their lives at the 9/11 2001 rest in peace. Amen. May God continue to strengthen and console their families. Amen.

10am. Please RSVP for September 19, as Evelyn is providing a luncheon for us!


