Father, Thank You for Bringing Us Here!

Mother Teresa of Calcutta, a woman I admire for her courage and resilience in living out her vocation of love in the face of challenges, emphasized that holiness does not consist in doing or saying extraordinary things, but in doing or saying the littlest things in extraordinary ways. This holiness is not a mere idea somewhere in the theological or religious books, nor is it a dogma declared by some church official. Instead, holiness is a way of living and a goal that every child of God must make for themselves.

The things that often point us to holiness or help us spot it in people are not always the noblest or most exotic actions or events in life. Rather, they can be the simplest actions of the littlest people who may be ignored for being too young or too old, less educated, or poor.

Last weekend, with the help of Alicia Harney, our parish PSR Coordinator, and several other adult chaperones, I had the privilege of taking our parish altar servers to Six Flags amusement park in St. Louis. Of all that happened from the time we left

the parish parking lot at 8:15 in the morning to when we arrived back later at 6:30 in the evening, the most memorable for me was the simple words of one of our little children: "Father, thank you for bringing us here." The child was not the only one who was grateful, nor the only one who expressed their gratitude for the opportunity. We are grateful that we all had a great time and returned safely. Thank God! However, the way the child said those words, effortlessly and joyfully, caught my attention in a striking way.

When I was reflecting on that, one of the things I thought about was: "Did I say the same thing to God about the trip?" While for the child, I was the one who made it possible, I know very well that it was God who made it happen. How naturally children can challenge us to grow holier every day if we give them the right environment to radiate that holiness, which is still impeccably present in them, can be refreshing and uplifting.




Prayer for the Sick
