## September 28th, 2025 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time **Raising Our Children Right**

With everything going on in our world today, it is easy to blame the larger society (school, workplace, government, private and public institutions of all kinds) for how miserable and wayward many of our children have become. Some are lost socially, or spiritually, or morally, or mentally, or completely and unable to function. Others are lost but still functioning barely enough to be counted in the family. Still, some of our family and friends are physically alive today but lost in one kind of deadly addiction or the other. We still have others who have lost their lives due to causes that could have been prevented by parents during upbringing. Recently, I found this incident on social media and decided to share it here.

"A man sentenced to death was about to be executed, before dying, he asked for only one thing, a pencil and a sheet of paper. Silence filled the cell as he wrote with deep concentration, minutes later, he handed the letter to the guard and said: Give this to my mother, in the letter he wrote "Mother, if justice were fair, I wouldn't be the only one to be punished, you would be here with me as

well". Do you remember when I stole a boy's bicycle, instead of correcting me you helped me hide it? When I took money from the neighbor you went with me to spend it? Do you remember when Dad tried to teach me what was right, you said he was too hard on me, I was just a child, I needed limits not support to do wrong. Today I am here, paying the price for everything I did but I forgive you. I only hope this letter reaches as many parents so they understand that saying no to a child can sometimes be the greatest act of love. Thank you for giving me life and for helping me lose it. Sincerely, Your condemned son"
