#### Jesus' Conditions for Discipleship

In today's Gospel, our Lord Jesus Christ lays down the radical conditions of discipleship: detachment from family ties, possessions, and even one's own life, carrying the cross, and persevering with full commitment. These conditions are not meant to negate love for others but to purify it, orienting everything to God. Discipleship is not half-hearted; it requires deliberate choice and total surrender.

The passage confronts our tendency as human beings to impose our personal and sometimes biased and selfish opinions on our Catholic Christian faith. In a world that prizes comfort, wealth, and status, Jesus insists that following Him involves sacrifice and counter-cultural priorities. The disciple takes community, school, and institutional activities seriously while prioritizing faith-related activities that strengthen our spiritual bonds with Christ and one another. For example, while sports of all kinds are good for our emotional and social health, they must not become a priority to the detriment of faith-based activities like the Holy Mass, catechisms, Bible study, pilgrimages, and PSR. As children of God, we must be willing to confront and oppose the pressure that the world continues to mount on us to prioritize worldly affairs. We must be willing to lose social comfort and public acceptance, material safety, and

personal ambition for the sake of the Kingdom of God. Christian life is a reordering of life's very foundations for a meaningful relationship with God. This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to accompany believers in discerning the cost of discipleship. Many today struggle with balancing faith and societal pressures—career, family expectations, and cultural norms. The role of the Church is to help people see that discipleship is not a burden but a path to authentic freedom. Carrying the cross does not end in despair but in resurrection hope.

Life of discipleship is what we are all called to live. It is the life that is rooted in the love of Christ and service to humanity. Discipleship reminds us that to "renounce all" is not to abandon life's blessings but to receive them anew in Christ. True discipleship demands cost, but it yields the incomparable gift of sharing in Christ's mission and eternal joy.

May the Love and Peace of Christ sustain us in all we do. Amen.


