St. Patrick Church Synodal Team Synod 2021-2023

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Introduction

The Process

The synodal journey for St. Patrick Church began when several members of the congregation attended a training session on the Synod Preparatory Document at St. Ann's Church sponsored by the Catholic Diocese of St. Thomas on November 10, 2021. The three-hour session was an introduction to the synodal process that would continue throughout the next few months.

On February 4, 2022, the Diocesan Committee met to discuss the kickoff of the Synodal process for the diocese. It was decided that there would be a special Mass on March 20, 2022, where the representatives of the respective parishes would attend and be recognized, thus formally commencing Synod 2021-2023 for the diocese. Due to unforeseen circumstances the special Mass and the official commencement of the Synodal process was cancelled.

On March 23, 2022, the St. Patrick Leadership Team consisting of the parish priest, the co-chairs of the parish Synodal Team and a participant in the initial training session, met to plan the beginning of the parish synodal process. They immediately identified the parish Synodal Team consisting of a diverse group of parishioners representing different ages, genders, and racial and cultural affiliations.

After the March 31, 2022, meeting, the Leadership Team commenced contacting parishioners to serve on the Synodal Team and introduced the congregation to the Synod process after each Mass. Announcements about the Synod process were also included in the church bulletins.

Subsequent weekly meetings of the Leadership Team were spent finalizing the Synodal Team and organizing for the initial meeting on April 20, 2022. That meeting consisted of an introduction to the Synodal process, the Vatican website resources, and material provided by the diocese. On April 21, 2022, Fr. Cyprian Tatah led a discussion with the Synodal Team and St. Patrick Parish Council about their attitudes toward their parish.

During the April 26th meeting the Synodal Team was organized into three committees:

- Promotion & Logistics Committee
- Survey & Synthesis Committee
- Special Synodal Session Committee session scheduled for May 22, 2022

Realizing that the diocesan synthesis report was due to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on June 30, 2022, the Synodal Team made following decisions:

- To use anonymous questionnaires to facilitate openness in responses and meet the selfimposed deadline of May 31, 2022, to collect feedback.
- Administer the surveys in groups to allow for discussion.
- Limit the number of questions to eleven to facilitate completion of the survey.

By May 10th the Synodal Team finalized the survey, displayed posters, included the survey in the bulletin and made announcements at weekend Masses. As a result, the subsequent sessions yielded 95 surveys:

- May 13th St. Patrick Elementary School Students (23)
- May 17th St. Patrick Church Ministries (28)
- May 21st Saturday Evening Mass (13)
- May 22nd -Sunday Morning Mass (24)
- Responses to SurveyMonkey Surveys (3)
- Responses to Adobe Fill-in Surveys (2)

Reflections and Challenges

Given the decision to use surveys, the process did not expressly embrace the themes of communion, participation and mission. There were occasions however that those themes were evident during this process.

• During the meeting with Fr. Tatah the members of the Parish Council and the Synodal Team responded to the following questions:

Question: What do you like about St. Patrick Catholic Church?

Responses: Expressions used to describe their experience - Family, Faith, Home, Ministries, Unity, Beauty, Commitment to ministry, Love for the Parish, Heart, Support of Parishioners.

Question: How would you improve St. Patrick Catholic Church?

Responses: Passing the baton of faith "Participation of Youth." Too stringent on rules as it relates to unwed parents. Need to be forgiving. Showing compassion to those who made mistakes along the way. Need a diaconate program – more men to participate and allow women to enter. Outreach-visitation of sick and elderly and more involvement of spiritual community. Evangelization. More parishioners' commitment needed. Improve/update filing census of all baptized and all parishioners, so we can reach out, especially when they stop attending Mass. Re-evangelization needed especially of Godparents and sponsors of the Confirmed. Welcome and forgive them, Be inclusive.

- During the Synodal Team's meeting to discuss the composition of the survey questions, there was a lively exchange of ideas about reasons for inclusion or exclusion of certain questions.
- During the meeting with the members of the ministries there were discussions about various questions on the survey.

Prior to commencing our survey of the parishioners, we realized that there would not be many respondents between the ages of 18-44 because of the absence of high school, college students and young adults in the congregation. Representatives from those age groups were included in the Synodal Team in hope that we would be able to leverage their contacts to augment the numbers. This was not realized.

The special Synodal session after Sunday Mass was designed to provide an opportunity for the congregation to engage in communion, participation and mission. Most of the participants ate the food, drank the refreshments, filled out their surveys and left. Consequently, the engagement we had hoped for did not materialize.

We also designed surveys for surrounding Christian churches in the hope that we would get their perspective on possible community issues on which we could collaborate. Due to the impending deadline for drafting the synthesis report, these surveys were not administered.


The synthesis report was drafted by the Survey & Synthesis Committee, reviewed and ratified by the St. Patrick Synodal Team on June 8, 2022.

Discernment of Collected Contributions

Demographics of Survey Respondents

Question 1 - Indicate your age group.


As we had predicted the survey of St. Patrick Church congregation yielded very few members of the Gen Z (ages 10-25) and Millennial (ages 25-41) age groups. We augmented our Gen Z respondents by asking 6th through 8th grade students at St. Patrick School to complete the surveys.

Question 2 - How would you classify yourself?

In response to how each age group viewed their religious affiliation the data is as follows:




Of the Gen Z population only 3 young people of 28 considered themselves "practicing Catholics." For the Boomers (90%) and Post War (87%) populations the vast majority considered themselves "practicing Catholics."

How the Respondents Feel About St. Patrick Church

Question 3 – Do you attend church regularly?

In response to this question 54% of the Gen Z answered "no," which is consistent with the low percentage (11%) that identified as "practicing Catholics." In the written responses to why Gen Z did



not attend church regularly. The primary reasons for not attending church were: *

- Their family no longer goes to church
- No desire to attend Mass
- Too busy to attend Mass

Almost all of the Millennial through Post War age groups indicated that they regularly attended church.

Question 4 - What do you like most about St. Patrick Church?

In response to this question the following positive qualities were attributed to St. Patrick Church: ‡

- The feeling of family and comradery among the congregation
- The beauty of the altar and church
- The choir
- The service (i.e., the Mass itself)

Question 5 - In what ways can we improve St. Patrick Church?

In response to this question survey participants recommended the following improvements for St. Patrick Church: ‡


- More of the congregation should join a ministry
- Sponsor activities that promote fellowship
- Augment organ with other instruments

- Reconnect with people baptized in the church
- Engage in community outreach to attract new members
- Air condition or add more fans in the church
- Targeted activities to

- 4. Other




Of the 6th to 8th grade respondents of St. Patrick School, six students expressed interest in becoming alter servers, two of whom who do not regularly attend church. Three other students expressed interest in being members of the youth group or lectors. These students may represent young people who are interested in becoming active participants in the church congregation.

Fifteen existing members of ministries offered to perform community outreach or fundraising in addition to their current duties. The challenge to sustaining this level of volunteerism is that 70% of the survey participants currently engaged in the ministries are 65 years or older.

Respondents' Perceptions of the Catholic Church

Question 7 - Do you believe that your voice is heard by the Church?



Two-thirds of the respondents felt that their voices were listened to by the Catholic church. For the third that believed their voices were not heard, they gave the following reasons: *

- Students indicated that they were too young
- Only certain individuals in leadership positions are heard
- · Concerns are not addressed by priests and others

Question 8 - How can the Church become more involved in community outreach?

In response to this question respondents made the following suggestions: ‡

- · Sponsor family-oriented community activities
- Get to know our neighbors around the church
- Visit shut-ins
- Fundraising to help the needy
- Tutoring of neighborhood children and adults

Question - 9. Are there traditions, policies, and practices that you believe the Church should reconsider?

Sixty-nine percent of the survey participants answered "no" to this question, the other thirty- one percent listed the following traditions, policies, and practices that the church should reconsider: [‡]

- Allowing women to be deacons
- Allowing priests to get married
- Allowing contemporary gospel music during Mass
- Accepting members of LGBTQ community
- Clarifying certain church practices:
 - o Treatment of marriages outside the church
 - o Practices concerning baptism

Question 10 - What relationship would you like to see our Church have with our brothers and sisters of other Christian denominations and other religions?

In response to this question respondents made the following suggestions: ‡

- Maintain a strong and friendly relationship with other religious denominations
- Invite other denominations to attend Mass
- Sponsor joint community activities to promote fellowship

Question 11 - What social issues do you think the Church should provide more guidance? Almost all of the survey participants responded to this question. There was a myriad of responses of areas that the Church could give more guidance. Below is the list of those areas: *

- Position on the LGBTQ+ community
- Activism in combatting racism and sexism
- Activism in reducing crime/gang violence
- Guidance on marriage and parenting
- Guidance on family planning and abortion
- Activism in preventing domestic and child abuse
- Activism in promoting mental health
- Activism in helping the impoverished

Conclusion: Next Steps

The Synod Team will schedule monthly thematic sessions for the congregation to meet to discuss the issues and recommendations received as part of the Synod survey process.

When we meet, we will schedule a person(s) from the appropriate Church or Government departments (e.g., Catholic Charities, Lutheran Social Services or VI Department of Human Services) to discuss the services that they provide that is germane to our topic. In this way our congregation will be able to offer guidance to existing services to those in need.

For those recommendations that our congregation will undertake in partnership with another entity or on our own we will develop an implementation plan listing milestones and the responsible parties. The group responsible for the task will report monthly to the congregation on the progress of the project.

By leveraging the talents of our congregation, we should be able realize the increase in fellowship, community engagement and growth of our faith community.

The church needs to attract all of God's people no matter who they are and how they may think differently with regards to the policies or practices of the church. It needs to open up to the suggestions or ideas that members can bring for the betterment of the institution. Catholics have left because of the strict policies regarding marriage, mental issues, abortion, same sex unions, unwed mothers, divorce, sexual misconduct within the Catholic institutions.

There have been countless times that I have made suggestions to the Pastor that have been ignored because he is more comfortable with a more traditional Mass. While the Pastor should be the representative of the Church hierarchy, he should be able to adapt to cultural and age preferences as long as they do not violate Catholic doctrine. It seems that certain Pastors yearn for the Church experience of their youth (even some yearning to do Mass in Latin), rather than making the Church experience relevant to its prospective congregation.
