10% (Assign points 1-10)
- 2. Extracurricular activities, civic activities or relevant work experience** (*bonus points for leadership/officer positions*)
40% (Assign points 1-50)
- 3. Essay**
50% (Assign points 1-40)

The Scholarship program will be reviewed annually and revised as necessary. The Board may modify these procedures and policies at any time. The Board also reserves the right to meet with a candidate when it is felt it would be necessary or appropriate to complete the decision process.
