



CITY OF LOG CABIN

Per Ordinance 65 – Ordinance Writing Procedures, passed and approved on May 20, 2021, by the Log Cabin City Council, to streamline and make efficient the numbering of past and future ordinances for convenience and ease of use, ordinances relating to **Restricting or Barricading** will be assigned to the number 14. From this date forward Ordinance **22- Restricting or Barricading** shall now be known as Ordinance **14- Restricting or Barricading**.

ORDINANCE # 22

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LOG CABIN, TEXAS RESTRICTING THE BARRICADING OR BLOCKING OF ANY STREET, ENTRANCE OR ROADS AND

WHEREAS, because of the conditions prevailing in the City of Log Cabin, the general welfare requires that all streets and thoroughfares be available for use by all citizens at all times, except for temporary closure for repair or utility construction.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF LOG CABIN, TEXAS


It shall be unlawful to barricade, block, or otherwise obstruct any gate or any gateway, street, road or other vehicular roadway designed for public passage by the use of gates, posts, fences, dirt, debris or other materials with the intention of obstructing the full use thereof by the public. It will also be unlawful to erect or maintain any obstruction which will prevent proper protection, ambulance, fire or other emergency services, or access by service representatives to residences, or interference with Emergency Management Operations (Sec.8, Ord. #10).

PENALTY:


Any person, Corporation or Association violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$200.00 (two hundred dollars). Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense.
