## **ORDINANCE 45A**

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT RESERVE**

THIS ORDINANCE SUPERSEDES ANY PRIOR ORDINANCE OR AMENDMENTS FOR THIS ORDINANCE FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT RESERVE. THIS ORDINANCE WILL ESTABLISH THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR HAVING RESERVE OFFICERS.

## **SECTION I: ESTABLISHMENT OF RESERVE OFFICERS**

The chief of the police department shall decide if the City of Log Cabin will have reserve officers. The police department is not required to have reserve officers. If the chief decides that reserve is needed or could be of use, then he/she may work with the mayor to obtain said officers.

The City of Log cabin will require all reserve officers to work a minimum of 16 hours a month to maintain his/her reserve status. Failure to work the minimum hours required may result in disciplinary action and/or termination. The City of Log Cabin will also be responsible for maintaining records for annual firearm qualifying requirements for said reserved officers.

## SECTION II: RESPONSIBILITIES OF RESERVE OFFICERS

All reserve officers must comply with all city ordinances, especially Ordinance 44 which depicts the rules, responsibilities, and requirements for any officer in the City of Log Cabin's Police Department.

Any police officer who violates any city ordinance, state law, city policies or permits and unauthorized passenger to ride with him/her in any police vehicle shall be subject to immediate discharge.
