


Child Memorial Card Catalogue





A Message from the Park Memorial Printshop

Welcome to the Park Memorial Memorial Children's Card Catalogue. This catalogue was designed to serve your needs. We feel privileged that you have chosen us to design your loved ones Memorial Card. It is important that you choose the card and images that are right for you in honoring the life of your loved one. We have put together this catalogue to help make this process as simple as possible. The catalogue has been divided into three key sections.

The first section outlines the different format of cards that we offer. We offer a wide range of cards from our Prayers Cards to Tribute Cards. Depending on the card that you choose you will need to either provide us with your special images or use our catalogue to find images that you find fitting.

Our cards were designed with you and your photos in mind. It is important to choose the right type of card for you. Some of our cards work best with horizontal photos while others require a vertical photo. For example, our Side Card requires a horizontal image for the cover and a vertical image for the interior while our Memorial Cards work best with a vertical cover and a horizontal interior. You can let the photos dictate the type of card that you choose or you can pick your card type and then find your photos.

The next section details each specific card and encourages you to provide your own images if you choose to do so. Providing your own images of your loved one adds a deeply personal touch to the Memorial Card. No one knows your loved one better than you and we encourage you to choose images with that in mind. We also understand that going through images may be a daunting process so we have included an extensive range of images in various categories that may best suit your loved one. This catalogue is a resource that we provide to help guide you through this process and it is really up to you how much or how little you use it. This catalogue can simply be used for inspiration.

The third part of the catalogue is where the card really starts to come together. You will have decided what type of card that you want to make (Tree Card, Holy Card, Prayer Card, Memorial Card, Tribute Card or an Oversized Memorial Card) and whether you are going to use our images, your own images, or maybe a combination of both. Now you are free to flip through our catalogue of provided images and decide which ones you would like to use.

Whether you decide to provide your own images or you wish to use ours, this catalogue will help you to do both. There are a wide variety of images, styles, and colors to fit the personality of your loved one.

We are available to answer any questions that you may have and to help you with your card in any way that we can. It can be a daunting process when it comes to choosing images and putting together a Memorial Card and we are here to help you every step of the way.

Instructions

Step 1:

Choose a Card Option

Your choice of Option will effect what verse and interior images are available. Remember the symbol associated with your Option choice. Appropriate style and themes will display your logo.

*Prices vary based on Layout and number of cards. Ask your director for more information.

Step 2:

Choose a Font

We offer a selection of Fonts that range from highly decorative to easy to read.

Step 3:

Choose a Verse

Verses are grouped in categories such as Religious, Popular, Ethnic and Specialty.

*Only select verses are compatible with prayer cards. Shorter verses work best on cards with limited space, i.e. Side Card. Multiple verses can be used if space allows.

Step 4:

Choose a Card Style and Theme

The cover portrait can be featured alone or be accompanied by a photo either supplied by yourself or choose from our children's section.

Step 5:

Add Embellishments

We offer a selection of clip art and association logos that can accompany the card to add a personal touch.
