From FR. C.P.:

While the Church is a community of disciples of Christ Jesus, it is also an organization of human beings. You must have all heard and seen the unauthorized episcopal ordination of four bishops in the SSPX (Society of Saint Pius X) and the excommunications that followed of those who were involved in this scandalous act. In this connection, the Holy See has announced that the whole society of SSPX is in a schism now, That means, attending the masses and other sacraments officiated by these bishops and priests who are members of this society makes those who participate in them schismatic too. The Pope had been making repeated appeals and requests to this society not to do this schismatic act but they turned a deaf ear to him and went ahead doing it illicitly anyway. So now, tens of thousands of people across the globe are not in communion with the universal Catholic Church because of this one act. While legalism as an ideology of human relationships is not to be encouraged, anarchy is also equally bad. In this context, as far as our parish is concerned, it has been notified to me that some people would like to have their own way, not caring for those who are in official positions, and not following the proper channel or protocol. Although their acts may not have major negative consequences in the life of the faith community, it breaks the decorum and sanctity of the appropriate running of an organization of believers. I would like to request everyone to seek proper approval before you take 'law and order' in your hands. I know that this may not concern most of the parishioners but only a few. But I thought that all of us can be aware of this, and improve our conduct in the parish and in the Church activities in a more orderly manner. Hoping to see the change.....
