
From FR C.P

Last Saturday, I had a severe sore throat which made me unable to preside over the mass. So, I had to make a last minute request to a couple of priests to cover for me for the evening mass. Fr. McDonald, a retired priest from Scottsbluff obliged. I am grateful to him for doing the mass for us, with an urgent last minute request made. Coincidentally just this past week, our bishop in his clergy notes has provided us with a guideline regarding "what may be done in the event that a last-minute situation arises, and no priest is available for a Sunday Mass of obligation". He wants us to keep a format in a folder/binder to be kept in the sacristy which can be used in such situations. We shall follow this, and entrust this ministry either the pastoral ministry team or some others in case of an emergency of this sort happens.

On another note, our bishop again writes to us, "On October 7, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary....With the state of the world at war in so many places, and on the brink of war in Western Europe, I am asking the faithful throughout our diocese to pray the rosary for peace. In our parishes, in our Catholic Schools, in small groups, in families. or individually on the Feast of the Holy Rosary next Tuesday, October 7, let us implore the Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede for urgent peace throughout the world and for the conversion of sinners. There are various rosary campaigns taking place on this day. Let us join them all in asking the Blessed Virgin Mary to transform hearts immersed in violence and hatred into missionaries of peace and goodwill as we pray the rosary for peace. With God all things are possible." (Bishop Hannefeldt, Clergy Notes, September 2025). Giving heed to the invitation of our bishop we shall pray the Rosary on October 7th, Tuesday, earnestly and with devotion for peace in the world. I will be leading a special rosary on that day at 5 pm, before the usual mass, at the Eucharistic adoration chapel. All those who are able to join me, please do. Others, please do pray the rosary that day for this special intention, at home, or wherever it is convenient for you individually or as a group.

The Cabrini Pledge: An Invitation to be Keepers of Hope From the US Bishops comes the Cabrini Pledge. To learn about the Cabrini Pledge, google those words and listen to the video by Bishop Seitz. Following is the pledge:

- 1. To affirm, in word and deed, the inherent dignity of every person. regardless of immigration status or country of origin, seeing each as a child of God before all else.
- 2. To engage with Scripture and the Church's social teaching, reflecting on the role of migration in salvation history, the history of the United States, and the history of my own family.
- 3. To listen and learn about the circumstances facing migrants and refugees, including those in my community, with an open heart and mind.
- 4. To seek opportunities for encounter, so as to grow in deeper understanding and communion that leads to an authentic solidarity with those in need.
- 5. To consider what it means to be a good neighbor and how I am called to reflect the love and hope of Christ to others.
- 6. To encourage civic dialouge that places the human person and the sanctity of families at the center of policymaking, especially toward the end of meaningful immigration reform.
- 7. To join with Pope Leo in praying for all migrants and refugees as fellow travelers on the journey to our homeland.
