1) Baptism in the Jordan: Affirms human dignity. 2) Wedding at Cana: Jesus responds to a practical community need, calling believers to stand with the vulnerable, the poor, and those who lack basic necessities.

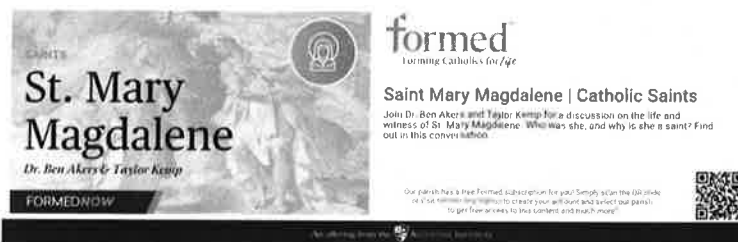
