From FR. C.P.:

One of the main scopes of Christianity is the alleviation of human suffering in our world. There are numerous Catholic organizations and agencies that work towards the wellbeing of those who are most vulnerable and marginalized in our society, nation, and the world. One of the religious orders in the Church that is focused on living lives of poverty in order that the poor may have their due is the Capuchins belonging to the Franciscan family, which was established by St. Francis of Assisi. We are in a special Franciscan jubilee year in honor of Francis Assisi on the occasion of the 800th anniversary of his death (1226-2026), announced by the Holy Father Pope Leo XIV. It will be our privilege to host a Capuchin Friar Fr. Vittorio Boria OFM Cap, from Denver, who will preside over the Holy Eucharist and preach at the weekend of June 27-28. He might also do an exhibition of St. Francis of Assisi, and the Capuchin Order. Kindly be generous with your donations to their mission. A couple of other organizations, namely the Cross Catholic Outreach and the Food for the Poor, will also make their appeals this year in the coming months through the representative priests of theirs. May our concerted efforts to eradicate poverty and hunger from our world bear fruits, by the grace of God.

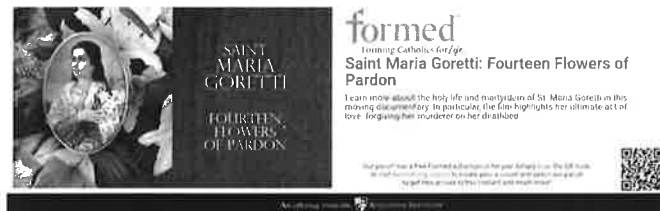

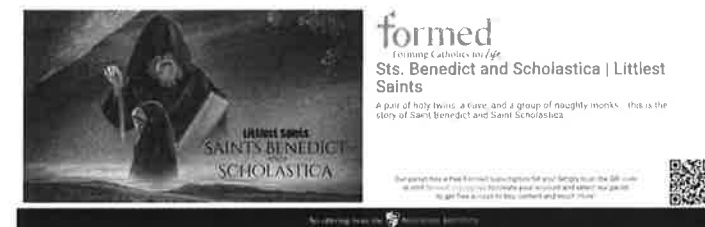
Totus Tuus:

Catholic Living:

Listening to the Voices of God

Thomas Berry was a priest who emphasized the sacredness of the Earth, the interconnectedness of all life, and the spiritual responsibility of humans to the natural world. He was born in Greensboro, NC and as a child "experienced a sense of the numinous wonder of nature, which remained a fixture of his spirituality." (*Blessed Among Us, Robert Ellsberg*) He entered the Passionist Monastery at age 20, was later ordained a priest, lived in China, taught the history of religion at Fordham. He was influenced by the Jesuit mystic and scientist, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin. His tender love for all of God's creation can lead us to look at the natural world around us with fresh eyes. Following is a quote, which may be helpful in experiencing the wonder of creation.
"The universe is composed of subjects to be communed with, not objects to be exploited. Everything has its own voice. Thunder and lightning and stars and planets, flowers, birds, animals, trees, - these have voices, and they constitute a community of existence that is profoundly related."
