Sheri Faust of Friends of the St. Clair River: This is a great public property parcel that been looked at to line up with a future Bridge to Bay Trail route connection.

Stephanie Beaver: Hi, I am a resident and Live at 7199 Meldrum Rd. My family and I love the park and have lived here since 2013. We have always wished there was a splash pad at the park for hot summer days. Please consider this with the upcoming grant. I feel the families around here would enjoy it as well

Katie Covert: I am writing this email in support of the new park for Ira township. My family and I have been members of the community for over 12 years and have raised our two children here and have benefited immensely from the existing park and all the events it offers. Outdoor recreation is an invaluable offering to small communities and would be greatly utilized by our family and many others. I ask that you please strongly consider adding this to our growing township.

Comments from the floor:

Amber Trombley commented that she is a life-long resident on Swan Creek Road and is excited that this will expand the park for a lot more families with more outdoor activities and park area.

Jean Corbat commented that she is very excited that the Township was able to purchase this additional 99-acre parcel for park development and looks forward to working with Community Foundation, the DNR and other grant opportunities to develop the Township parks.

Stella Ruhlman commented that as a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission she cannot wait to see the parks improved.

Jim Endres, Jr., thanked the St. Clair County Community Foundation for its help to write the applications for the grants.

Cindy Babisz thanked the Ira Township DPS and Fire Department for working together with the Parks and Recreation Department for the benefit of Township residents and for clearing paths to the new property for development.
