State	State	Renewal of St. Clair County Senior Citizens Millage To raise funds to be used for the sole purpose of providing senior citizens services in St. Clair County, shall St. Clair County be authorized to levy a millage of .8 mills (\$.80 per \$1,000 of taxable value) per year, which has been reduced to .7971 (\$.7971 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by required rollbacks, constituting renewal of a previously approved voter authorized millage, for a period of four years, being 2026 through 2029 inclusive? If approved, this renewed millage is estimated to generate \$6,913,513 in revenue in its first year. If approved, this renewed millage is estimated to generate \$4,330,595 in revenue in its first year.
