Father EJ has a BA degree in Philosophy from Mount Angel Seminary, St. Benedict OR & an MDiv & STB degree from St. Patrick Seminary and University, Menlo Park, CA.



Liturgy of the Day:

2nd Scrutiny: On this second Sunday of March, when we are all invited to look deeply into our lives, we hear the story of Jesus giving sight to the man who had been blind. When he did so, some of the authorities willfully refused to see, refusing to recognize the miracle because it was performed on the sabbath and attested to by a sinner. Let us look at our own lives and recall the times when we failed to recognize God's grace, refusing to see with eyes of faith.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

What does it mean to see? How do we fail to see? Samuel saw the strong and imposing sons of Jesse, but failed to look into the heart of each one. Paul encouraged the Ephesians to live in the light of Christ, where they could see what was pleasing to the Lord. Jesus cured the blind man, who soon recognized Jesus as Lord, but others refused to see Jesus as anything but a sinner because he cured him on the sabbath. Listening to today's reading, let us note who truly discerns what they see, who fails to do so, and what makes the difference.

Reflection:

It is tempting to think that when things are going well it is because God is pleased with us and when they aren't, we have done something "wrong." Perhaps, this kind of reasoning is more "comfortable" than the alternative which is to take responsibility for the choices we have made. Such an attitude also does a disservice to God. He is not keeping a tally to determine punishments and rewards. God is constantly pouring our his love and grace in the midst of good and bad times. Do you believe that God loves you all the time?
