Teach Us to Pray

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

Genesis 18:20-32 | Colossians 2:12-14 | Luke 11:1-13

July 27, 2025

It's probably the most familiar prayer in all of Christianity—the "Our Father." Many of us can recite it from memory without hesitation. But this weekend, we hear Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer—shorter and sparser than the version we find in Matthew's Gospel.

Luke's version of the prayer is just five petitions long:

"Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

(Luke 11:2–4)

Compare that to Matthew's fuller version (Matthew 6:9–13), which adds phrases like "who art in heaven," "thy will be done," "deliver us from evil," and ends with the familiar doxology many Christians pray: "For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory..."

So why the difference?

Luke writes to a primarily Gentile audience unfamiliar with Jewish prayer customs. **His focus is on relationship and dependence on God.** It's raw, urgent, and pared down to the essentials—almost like a desperate knock at the door in the middle of the night. In contrast, Matthew's version—used in the Sermon on the Mount—is more liturgical, structured for a Jewish-Christian audience familiar with temple prayer, and meant for communal worship.

But in both Gospels, Jesus offers the prayer not as a formula, but as a way of being—a roadmap of intimacy, humility, and trust. The word "Father" (Greek: Abba) in both versions sets the tone: not a distant deity, but a God who is personal, relational, and caring.

The First Reading from Genesis gives us a striking parallel. Abraham dares to intercede for the city of Sodom, respectfully but persistently negotiating with God. "What if there are fifty righteous people? Forty? Thirty? Twenty? Ten?" Abraham's courage is rooted in his trust in God's justice and mercy. Like the disciples who ask Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray," Abraham models a bold, personal dialogue with the Lord—one that seeks not just answers, but relationship.

Following the prayer, Luke includes two parables: one of a friend persistently knocking at midnight, and the other of a father who gives good things to his children. These aren't just about praying harder—they're about praying confidently, because we are known and loved.

"Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Luke 11:9)

This is not a vending machine promise. It's a call to faithful, honest, bold relationship with the Father. And the Lord's Prayer becomes the pattern for how we live and trust in that relationship. When we pray as Jesus taught us, we learn to ask for what we need, to seek what truly matters, and to knock at the door of God's will—not just hoping it opens, but trusting that it will.

So, this week, whether you pray the Lord's Prayer in the pews, in your car, with your family, or in the silence of your heart, pray it with fresh eyes and open hands. Let it shape your asking, your seeking, your knocking. And may it always lead you closer to the Father who knows what you need—even before you ask. Amen!

Liturgy of the Day:

When we want something from a friend, whether it's something they have or a favor they could do for us, we normally just go ahead and ask. Jesus tells his disciples today that we should approach God the same way. He assures us that the Father in heaven listens to our prayers and that we should persist in prayer, for we are a needy people, ultimately dependent on God. Our lives are in God's hands and so we pray that God watches over us, forgives us, and has mercy on us, as we proclaim when praying how Jesus taught us.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Before we hear Jesus teach his disciples to pray, we see Abraham persistently petition God to show mercy toward the people of the city of Sodom. In the Gospel, Jesus confirms how important it is to show this kind of persistence. Our Father in heaven, Jesus teaches us, is generous beyond human generosity, having given the Holy Spirit to be with us always, and so we should freely ask for our needs assured that we will be heard.

Reflection:

WE believe that God will answer our prayers; but, often wonder why so many of our prayers seem to go unanswered. Do we need to follow a special formula, do something specific, or offer our prayer in a special place? There is no magic involved nor is there a specific criteria we have to follow. These seemingly unanswered prayers are being answered – it just isn't the answer we wanted. The "problem" is not the prayer or how we pray – it is in what we are praying for. A man prayed every day to win the lottery and finally one day God spoke to him: "Buy a ticket!" What do you pray for and do you do your part to make what you ask for possible?
