Weekly Stewardship Reflections

July 6, 2025 - Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time IS 66:10-14C; PS 66:1-7, 16, 20; GAL 6: 14-18; LK 10:1-12, 17-20

In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's consider at

least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each



other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ; we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them in the Church and within our parish family. Aloha St. Catherine Parish 'Ohana!

My name is Father E J Ikaika Resinto, and I am truly humbled and grateful to begin my ministry here as your new pastor. Yes, E J is my legal name. Just initials. I was born and raised right here on Kaua'i in Puhi, so coming home after close to 20 years away is a real blessing.

A little about my background — I'm a proud graduate of Wilcox Elementary School and Kaua'i High School (Class of 2005). I earned my B.A. in Philosophy from Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon, and later received both my Master of Divinity and Master of Arts degrees from St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, California.

My parents are Eddie and Shanyne (Texeira) Resinto, and I have one younger brother, Ridge, who lives here on Kaua'i with his wife Sarah and their three sons: Elijah, Jaxtyn, and Harden.

My journey in faith is deeply rooted in our island community. I was baptized at St. Raphael Church in Kōloa, received my First Holy Communion and Confirmation at Immaculate Conception Church in Līhu'e, and was ordained a transitional deacon there as well on December 19, 2015. I was ordained to the priesthood on July 9, 2016, at the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in Honolulu. This week I will celebrate nine years of priestly ministry for the Diocese of Honolulu. I've served at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in 'Ewa Beach and most recently as Pastor of Sacred Heart Church and Maryknoll School in Honolulu.

As I was reflecting on this Sunday's Gospel, where Jesus returns to His hometown of Nazareth and faces skepticism from those who "thought they knew Him," I couldn't help but smile. Coming home can be humbling, and sometimes surprising, but it's also an opportunity for grace. I hope and pray that as I begin this new chapter with you, we'll be open to discovering how God continues to work in familiar faces, ordinary moments, and in this beautiful community we call home.

A scripture that has guided my ministry these past nine years is 1 Corinthians 13:13 — "So faith, hope, and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love." I truly believe God reveals His love in the simplest ways, and I look forward to sharing that love with you here at St. Catherine.

When I'm not at the parish, I enjoy gathering with family and friends, cooking and baking (I'm always experimenting with new recipes), traveling and learning about different cultures, and geeking out over history — especially Hawaiian history.

I'm so happy to be back on Kaua'i and excited to reconnect with this community. I promise to do my best to give glory to God in all things and to humbly serve this parish 'ohana. Please feel free to introduce yourself after Mass or around town. I can't wait to meet all of you!

Liturgy of the Day:

Imagine that on this day, Jesus sends you and several dozens of your fellow parishioners to nearby town or neighborhoods to spread the gospel. Today we hear Jesus do just that with

seventy-two of his disciples. He empowers them to call for repentance, heal the sick, drive out demons, and preach the kingdom of God. "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few," he tells them then and us now. May God's word inspire us to spread the Good News and may the Eucharist nourish and sustain us as we labor in the fields of the Lord.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Difficulties are many, but our reward is great. Isaiah finds comfort in Jerusalem, our spiritual home, despite the fact that at the time it lay in ruins, leading the Israelites to morn for its prior greatness. Paul bears the marks of his persecution but boasts in the saving cross. Jesus sends his disciples out like lambs among wolves, but they return rejoicing with their success. Whatever our difficulties are today, may we, like all the earth, cry out to God with joy.

Reflection: We do not grow in our discipleship by ourselves. When Jesus sent the disciples out, he sent them two by two. No matter where we are in life, we always have a need for others who are also committed to this journey. We need to have someone who can work with us and share the load. We need someone to help us see more clearly what we are being called to do and get back on track when we start to wander. Do you have someone who you can talk to about your journey? *Come and see the works of God, His tremendous deeds among men.* - psalm 66:5




