The Truth Hurts... But Sets Us Free
20th Sunday in Ordinary Time
August 17, 2025

Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 / Hebrews 12:1-4 / Luke 12:49-53

We've all heard the saying: "The truth hurts." And yes—that's the truth of the matter. Whether it comes through confrontation or constructive criticism, the truth can sting. Sometimes it leaves us insulted or discouraged. Other times it humbles us, helping us to grow beyond our weaknesses and flaws.

The way we respond to truth makes all the difference. We can react defensively—firing back with our own criticisms—or we can respond with humility, saying, "Thank you," and discerning how we might change for the better. The truth may hurt, but it should never lead us to anger.

We see this reality clearly in today's readings. In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah speaks God's truth to Israel, calling them to repentance. His words are not well received—so much so that he is imprisoned and condemned to death. Yet Jeremiah remains faithful. He does not stop speaking the truth, and he does not give in to anger or bitterness.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks a hard truth: "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." At first this sounds shocking. Is Jesus promoting conflict? No—He is forewarning us that the truth of the Gospel will cause division, even in families, because His message is often counter to the ways of the world.

Throughout His ministry, Jesus challenged people to think beyond societal norms: eating with sinners, speaking with women, healing the outcast, and proclaiming that His Body and Blood bring eternal life. His mission was one of peace, mercy, and the Father's love—but also one of repentance and conversion. Like the prophets before Him, speaking the truth would lead to His rejection, suffering, and death... yet also to the salvation of the world.

Living the truth will never be easy. Sometimes it will cause strain in our relationships, even with those closest to us. Families can be divided over politics, values, faith, or generational differences. In such times, we must never water down the truth or conform to the secular world. But we must also speak the truth with love, never with anger, for "God is love."

This week, instead of looking for an argument, let us pray—for unity in our homes, our parish, our island, and our world. May the loving truth of Jesus warm the hearts of those who are hurt or divided. And may we, with courage and charity, be empowered to witness to Christ's truth—so that all may be set ablaze with the fire of His love.

Liturgy of the Day: Today's second reading speaks of a great cloud of witnesses, perhaps referring to the large number of Christians who gave witness to their faith through their words and actions. Baptized in the Lord, we are those witnesses now. Looking around and seeing our faith community gathered here today, let us think of ourselves as a "great cloud of witnesses," assured of each others' support and encouragement as we live out our discipleship to the Lord.

#### **Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:**

Today's readings are difficult to hear. Jeremiah's preaching so inflamed the people of Judah that he was thrown into a pit to die. Jesus warned his disciples that he came to inflame people so much that parents would turn against their children and vice versa. Nevertheless, says the author of Hebrews, we must persevere in our faith, endure our cross, and resist sin, so that one day we may find the joy that lies before us. As we suffer hardships on our journey to the Lord, may God's word encourage us to never give up.

**Reflection:** Some preachers tell their people that if they make Jesus their Lord, everything will be fine and all will be well. That is not the message that Jesus gave us. He was very clear that to follow him would be difficult and bring us suffering and rejection. So why should we even try? The peace and joy that comes with our discipleship is not based on earthly things. It is found in trying to do God's will everyday. It comes form being in tune with God and trusting that no matter what happens, God's love and grace will be with us. It is God's peace that our souls are secure and we know that all will be well no matter what is happening around us. Though I am afflicted and poor, yet the Lord thinks of me. -psalm 40:17
