

The Discipline of the Lord: A Path to Perfection

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 24, 2025

In this Sunday's second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, we hear words that can be both challenging and consoling: "The Lord disciplines the one he loves" (Hebrews 12:6). At first, that can sound harsh—why would a loving God allow us to struggle? But the author of Hebrews reminds us that

discipline is not punishment; it is the loving care of a Father who wants His children to grow strong, holy, and whole.

The Letter to the Hebrews presents Jesus to us as the great High Priest—the One who knows our human weakness, shares in our suffering, and yet transforms it into salvation. Unlike the priests of the Old Covenant, who offered temporary sacrifices, Jesus offered Himself once and for all on the Cross. His sacrifice was not only perfect—it made us perfect in God's eyes. **Through Him, we are drawn into God's family and invited to live a life that is priestly, offering our joys, struggles, and daily lives as a "sacrifice of praise" to the Father.**

This is good news for us when life feels heavy. Christ Himself was "made perfect" through suffering—not because He lacked anything, but because His human nature, like ours, was fully tested, refined, and glorified. In the same way, when we face trials, God is not abandoning us. Rather, **He is shaping us, strengthening us, and drawing us into deeper communion with His Son.**

So, if you are carrying a cross right now, if you are suffering in any way, and or struggling to understand why you have this cross or pain, take heart: **Jesus walks with you.** His wounds are the very sign of His love and His solidarity with us. As Hebrews says, "lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees" (12:12). God's discipline is always ordered toward life, hope, and peace. It is the Father's way of making us more like Christ—capable of divine life and ready for the joy of eternal glory.

Liturgy of the Day: Anyone who has driven often on highways can recall times in which traffic has slowed to a standstill because of a bottleneck, when multiple lanes of traffic must funnel down to a single open lane. This contemporary phenomenon is analogous to Jesus' words today about getting into heaven. Jesus says people will come from every direction but must pass through a narrow gate to enter. Let us accept this challenge, patiently following that narrow path.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

God reveals to Isaiah that people from far and wide will be welcomed to the holy city, Jerusalem. The psalmist also invites people of every nation to glorify God. Centuries later, Jesus affirms that people from every point of the compass will be welcomed into the kingdom of God. That having been said, getting in is not easy and some will be sent away. May we embrace God's discipline, in the spirit in which it is explained in the second reading today, recognizing that it is offered out of God's great love for us.

Reflection:

Each of us will receive as we have given. What can be given to someone whose hands are closed? If we hold on tightly to what we have, we cannot receive anything. However, if we open our hands to help others, then we can also receive from others. We will not be judged on how well we kept the rules, how often we went to church or even how much we put in the collection box. Instead we will be asked how we helped others, how we cared for the least among us, how we used our gifts to build up our community. We will make mistakes and even fail miserably at times; but, the key is to keep trying. Each day is a new opportunity to walk with the Lord and share God's love with everyone we meet.




